Disclosure Questionnaire Category: Industries at Risk for Human Rights Violations

Topic	Cotton / Raw Material Supply Chain
Summary of Issue	Princess Polly is an online retailer that sells women's clothing and aims to make on-trend fashion sustainable and accessible.
	Apparel supply chains are diverse and complex, spanning many tiers, leading to an increased risk of human rights violations. Around 20% of global cotton comes from the Xinjiang Uyghur Autonomous Region in China, where human rights violations are a key material risk.
	Princess Polly outsources 100% of production and has not achieved full supply chain traceability (e.g., material sourcing).
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	21% of all the company's products are made from cotton.
Impact on Stakeholders	The use of cotton poses a human rights risk due to the possibility that they are sourced from conflict-affected and high-risk areas, where it may be used to finance conflict and/or be associated with human rights abuses in the supply chain.
Implemented Management Practices	For tier 1 suppliers, the company has a detailed onboarding process. This includes a transparency survey, background check, review, and signature of the company's code of conduct, proof of a valid business license, ability to pursue low-impact material, a site visit performed by Princess Polly's staff with an anonymous worker survey, and a mandatory requirement to meet a third-party ethical audit. In an effort to ensure ethical sourcing of their raw materials, the company has the following practices in place:
	 Prohibition of cotton sourcing (present in the company's Code of Conduct) from high-risk countries such as Uzbekistan, Turkmenistan, and Xinjiang.



	 A Cotton Sourcing Strategy to expand the supply chain beyond China. The strategy entails moving a significant part of cotton garments (t-shirts and woven cotton) to regions that are cotton self-sufficient, such as India, Pakistan, and Mexico. For cotton-rich products manufactured in China, the company started a transition to use only GOTS and GRS-certified cotton. In 2023, third-party certified cotton accounted for 21.9% of the total cotton used by the company.

Торіс	Litigation related to copyright infringement
Summary of Issue	Princess Polly is an online retailer that sells women's clothing and aims to make on-trend fashion sustainable and accessible. In the last five years, the company had one litigation case related to copyright infringement. The plaintiff accused the company of copying its sunglasses designs. The company sees that any perceived similarity was unintentional, but it settled the case to resolve the situation in a timely manner.
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	The value of settlement is confidential but represents less than 1% of the company's revenues.
Impact on Stakeholders	The main stakeholder affected is the competitor that initiated the litigation.
Resolution	The case was settled with a payment.
Management Practices	Princess Polly took the following actions: 1. Stopped selling the disputed products 2. Reviewed current and future assortments for any additional potential IP issues 3. Investigated the root cause 4. Cooperated with the company, providing details regarding; units purchased, units sold, sales, and supplier information 5. Gave a warning to the Buyer responsible 6. Conducted copyright training for all Merch team members 7. Paid the settlement amount

Topic	Negative PR/ Greenwashing Accusation
Summary of Issue	Princess Polly is an online retailer that sells women's clothing and aims to make on-trend fashion sustainable and accessible.
	There are some independent articles/blog posts challenging Princess Polly's claims of sustainable fashion and categorizing the company as a fast-fashion company, focused on unlimited growth and low-quality production.
Impact on Stakeholders	Misleading marketing claims can affect consumers' choices. Furthermore, over-consumption and irresponsible apparel production pose a great risk of environmental degradation and human rights violations.
Implemented Management Practices	The term 'fast fashion' is often associated with micro-trends, rapid production, low-quality materials, cheap pricing, and unethical manufacturing.
	Princess Polly, however, identifies as a demand fashion business rather than a fast fashion brand. By leveraging proprietary demand and trend forecasting tools, they can quickly bring trends to market without overproduction. Their just-in-time replenishment model ensures accessible pricing, as excess inventory costs are not factored into their pricing structure.
	In addition, Princess Polly has a comprehensive ethical sourcing program. All production factories undergo valid ethical manufacturing audits and are visited in person by the Princess Polly team at least every two years. Their 5 A's Ethical Sourcing Program won Best Ethical Sourcing Initiative at the 2023 NORA Sustainability Awards, and in 2024, the brand achieved the highest bracket in the Baptist World Aid Ethical Fashion Report.
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
