Disclosure Questionnaire Category: Disclosure Outcomes & Penalties

Issue Date	July 11, 2019
Topic	Anti-Competitive Behavior
Summary of Issue	Based on a complaint from the Unions Agrarias-UPA Union, the CNMC (National Commission on Markets and Competition) in Spain launched an investigation which led to the issuance of a fine for eight companies (including CAPSA) who operate in the raw cow's milk supply market for activities between the years 2000 and 2013. The CNMC said the illegal behavior consisted of the exchange of information that allowed for the coordination of sales strategies to the detriment of the interests of the farmers and thereby a violation of competition law.
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	CAPSA was issued a fine of € 21,800,000. The amount of the penalty was calculated based on the annual turnover of those allegedly involved. 4 employees from CAPSA were named in the penalty: 2 current
	executives (at the time of the incident, they were at a lower level) and 2 at the operational level (field/milk collection managers)
Impact on Stakeholders	The primary impact would involve farmers and competitors.
Resolution	Following appeals, the National Court has reduced the infringement period by almost half, requesting that the CNMC recalculate the penalty. The judgment containing these pronouncements is also being appealed by CAPSA.
Implemented Management Practices	CAPSA reaffirms its commitment to Spanish livestock farmers. CAPSA has recognized, among its commitments and within the Code of Ethics, a recognition for the respect of fair and transparent competition.
	Since 2020, CAPSA has been certified according to <u>UNE 19.601</u> , having passed all annual audits since then with a satisfactory result. Furthermore, in 2025, it began the process of obtaining the certification of <u>UNE 19603 standard</u> lays out the requirements and directives to develop an effective compliance



	management system in organizations to comply with free competition.
	CAPSA has also stopped participating in numerous forums and dairy meetings and has established a Compliance Model.
Related Incidents (Yes/No)	Related to the CNMC penalty, CAPSA is involved in a civil lawsuit from SAT San Antón (a cattle farmers' cooperative) naming 4 companies (including CAPSA) with the claim amount for CAPSA being 2.3 million Euros. All related claims have been dismissed, with the Sat San Anton claim, in particular, dismissed with costs.
