Торіс	Clients in Controversial Industries
Summary of Issue	Granular Energy is a technology based firm providing software tools related to clean energy management solutions for utilities, energy managers, traders, and large energy buyers worldwide. The company has had clients in the Fossil-Fuel (includes coal/oil sands and non- coal/oil sands),Nuclear Power or Hazardous Materials and Water Utilities, industries which are deemed controversial by B Lab. The services provided to these is providing them with a SaaS platform to allocate electricity generated to electricity consumed in order to provide reporting to end consumers on the origin of their electricity. The service and product provided are mainly targeted at electricity retailers (also called energy suppliers). Some of these companies are branches of oil and gas companies or
	subsidiaries of Water Utility companies and some are companies involved in operating nuclear power stations.
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	In the fiscal year end of 2023, the company had generated 1% of total revenue from clients in the fossil-fuel (coal/oil sands) industry, 23% of total revenue from clients in the fossil-fuel (non coal/oil sands) industry and 20% of total revenue from clients in the water utilities industry. No revenue was made from clients in the Nuclear Power or Hazardous Materials industry as only a free pilot project was conducted with them. A paid project with them could happen in the future.
Impact on Stakeholders	Companies that work with clients in controversial industries can indirectly increase the harmful impact to stakeholders by enabling business growth. Therefore, companies that work with clients in these industries should have practices in place to ensure that their impact is aimed at decreasing the negative impacts of the industry.
	B Lab has flagged the involvement of companies with clients in controversial industries as a material issue and new standards will be created to address possible risks related to this matter.
Implemented	Granular Energy does not have a specific position on working

Management Practices	with sensitive industries or a policy to move away from them.
	The software tool provided by the company is solely used to create and manage green electricity offers and avoid potential greenwashing by providing additional transparency on the origin of electricity to their customers, including hourly matching between consumption and generation.
	When working with a new customer, the company has added a step in its sales process to fill a form to get approval from executives if the client is from a controversial industry. The sales team needs to justify in the form why they consider it OK to work with the company (e.g. they would be only helping the renewable branch of an oil & gas company to grow).
