SUMMARY OF ISSUE	As a manufacturer of ceramics, large amounts of energy are required to power the production processes of ceramic tile plants, with consequent direct and indirect impacts on the local area and the environment.
SIZE/SCOPE OF ISSUE (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	"Considering the electrical and thermal extraction required for the production of porcelain stoneware, ceramic falls into the category of subjects defined as ""energy-hungry"". Porcelaine stoneware companies uses natural gas for the cooking and drying process and for the production of electricity and electricity taken from the grid.
	The main contribution to the Carbon Footprint is given by the combustion of natural gas for the cooking process and production of electricity. The total use of energy of the Italgraniti Group S.p.A. factory in the 2021 was of 189.910,578 kWh while the total production of the factory in the same year was of 5.796.899 square meters of tiles so the energy used to produce one square meters of product is 32,76 kWh/m2.
IMPACT ON STAKEHOLDERS	The production of this quantity of energy involves not only the emission of polluting gases (carbon emissions) but also noise emissions that have indirect/direct impacts on climate change and common health. The carbon emissions associated with their operations and their contribution to climate change along with air pollution and associated health impacts of air quality are the potential impacts of their energy intensity. The production of the energy required in the production of the tiles is associated with the emission of GHG which are the main contributor to climate change. Additionally, energy production is associated with air and noise pollution that have direct and indirect impacts on human health and wellbeing
IMPLEMENTED MGT PRACTICES	In the Italgraniti Group S.p.A. plant, all the hot flow resulting from cooking is recovered for the drying process. In this way the emission of polluting gases into the atmosphere is avoided and reduced. This practice also makes it possible to optimize the use of energy itself. The company, as energy-intensive, is part of the companies obliged to subscribe to the Emission Tranding system. Confindustria Ceramica and the Italian control bodies in charge supervise the correct communication of CO2 emissions (verified by a third party Certiquality) and the correct compensation through the purchase of quotas or use of free quotas assigned.
