SUMMARY OF ISSUE	Coffee is a perennial crop, planted once in a while. Always following the farm planning of each farm. Due to this fact, coffee growing is considered monoculture.
SIZE/SCOPE OF ISSUE (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	Sancoffee is formed by 20 coop members who are the owners of the cooperative. In the 2021 fiscal year, 98% of Sancoffee revenue was earned from the sale of coffee. From the total of 15,827.81 hectares of land, 6,752.34 correspond to coffee, 4,713.93 correspond to native vegetation, and the remaining 4,361.54 are used for pasture, planting of annual crops, commercial forests, among others.
IMPACT ON STAKEHOLDERS	In Sancoffee's business model, the needs of each one of its stakeholders are important for the cooperative's decision-making. It seeks to generate value and solutions for everyone it interacts with, some key points are: 1) Quality and consistency; 2) Reliability in all procedures throughout the supply chain; 3) Traceability and transparency in the information flow; 4) Innovation; 5) Open and close relationship with the community; 6) Social and environmental commitment with their stakeholders. The most of the farms follows the principles of sustainability, having practices to preserve and conserve the nature, as conservation of water resources; conservation of forest and natural ecosystems; restoration of degraded areas; plantation of native trees and many others practices. Looking for best in the field the producers use ecological techniques as grass management protecting the soil of exposure to high temperatures, allowing the soil to keep organic matter and increase the capacity of water retention. To optimize the management of the plantation reducing the use of pesticides/fertilizers, in the farms are used precision agriculture providing to the soil and plants exactly what they need without excess. Also other practices are implemented inside the Cooperative making the operation more efficient always seeking consistency and quality.
