Sensitive issues identified through background checks may or may not be within the scope of questions in the Disclosure Questionnaire, but undergo the same review process and are subject to the same possible review by the Standards Advisory Council, including ineligibility for B Corp Certification, required remediation, or disclosure.

Any party may submit a complaint about a current B Corp through B Lab's Public Complaint Process. Grounds for complaint include:

- Intentional misrepresentation of practices, policies, and/or claimed outcomes during the company's certification process
- 2) Breaches of the B Corp Community's core values as expressed in our Declaration of Interdependence

Topic	Clients in Controversial and Ineligible Industries	
Summary of Issue	Third Rock Finland Oy has clients in the following industries: Nuclear Power or Radioactive Materials, Pharmaceuticals, Mining, and Fossil Fuels.	
	The types of services offered to these clients include: • Sustainability consulting services. In the past, the company has also worked with clients in other ineligible industries, including Gambling. The company has not earned any revenue from these clients in the last fiscal year.	
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	In the last fiscal year, 3.80% of the company's annual revenue was from clients in the Fossil Fuels industry; 2% from the Pharmaceutical industry; 2.30% from the Nuclear Power or Radioactive Materials industry; and 0.70% from the Mining industry.	
Impact on Stakeholders	Companies that work with clients in controversial industries can directly or indirectly increase the harmful impact to stakeholders by enabling business growth. Therefore, companies that work with clients in these industries should have practices in place to ensure that their impact is aimed at decreasing the negative impacts of the industry.	
	Companies offering certain types of services and products to controversial clients are required to have at a minimum a grievance/complaints mechanism and a whistleblower protection policy.	
Implemented Management Practices	Third Rock Finland Oy has the following mechanisms in place to manage the risks related to its business relationships with clients in controversial and ineligible industries: Grievance/complaints mechanism. This is accessible to the public through a Grievance Form available on the company's website. This policy applies to all employees, contractors, partners, customers, and other stakeholders who may have concerns about the company's activities or who may identify wrongdoing in its activities.	



Once a grievance is submitted, the company acknowledges its receipt within 7 business days. The complainant will be informed within three months if any further actions will be taken, subject to the legal constraints of confidentiality and privacy, and the proper conduct of the investigation. Third Rock's management will take decisions on further action and whether to launch a full investigation, where appropriate in consultation with Third Rock's human resources team and independent external experts. The decision to close the case will be taken by Third Rock's management in consultation with the other members of the investigation team, if any.

The case may be closed if:

- The notification turns out to be incorrect;
- No sufficient information is available to allow further investigation.
- The issue behind the notification has already been resolved.

Whistleblower Protection Policy. This policy sets out policies and procedures which Third Rock will follow to ensure that its stakeholders can report concerns, ethical violations and other misconduct related to Third Rock's activities without any fear of retaliation.

The company is committed to protecting whistleblowers as follows:

- Individuals carrying out the investigation are not involved in the alleged misconduct; the investigation is conducted by an impartial person, and only those involved in the investigation have access to the system.
 All notifications are investigated promptly, independently, and impartially.
- The whistleblower must not be treated unfairly or discriminated against, pressured, or punished for reporting.
- Prohibited retaliation includes, but is not limited to, any conduct that would diminish the terms and conditions of employment, dismiss or lay off an employee, or otherwise treat a person unfavorably because the person has made a report or otherwise participated in an investigation.
- Notifications are treated confidentially, and the identity of the whistleblower is kept confidential to the extent permitted by law.



	 If a whistleblower feels they have been retaliated against, he/she/they are encouraged to report the incident through Third Rock's whistleblowing channels. If the whistleblower feels that he or she has been subjected to retaliation, he or she has the right to seek
_	compensation. Retaliation can lead to legal sanctions, which may even result in the termination of the employment or contract. All retaliation will be reported to the Third Rock Board.
