



## DISCLOSURE MATERIALS

Certified B Corporations must complete a Disclosure Questionnaire to identify potentially sensitive issues related to the company (e.g. historical fines, sanctions, material litigation, or sensitive industry practices).

This component does not affect the company's score on the B Impact Assessment. If the company answers affirmatively to any items in the Disclosure Questionnaire and B Lab deems them to be material, the company must:

- 1) Be transparent about the disclosure issues identified on the company's public B Impact Report
- 2) Describe how the company has addressed this issue.
- 3) Demonstrate that management systems are in place to avoid similar issues from arising in the future.

In all cases, the Standards Advisory council reserves the right to refuse certification if the company is ultimately deemed not to uphold the spirit of the community.

In addition to the voluntary indication of sensitive issues in the Disclosure Questionnaire, companies pursuing Certification also are subject to background checks by B Lab staff. Background checks include a review of public records, news sources, and search engines for company names, brands, executives/founders, and other relevant topics.

Sensitive issues identified through background checks may or may not be within the scope of questions in the Disclosure Questionnaire, but undergo the same review process and are subject to the same possible review by the Standards Advisory Council, including ineligibility for B Corp Certification, required remediation, or disclosure.

<b>SUMMARY OF ISSUE</b>	The Duppy Share is a wholesaler that earns a material amount of revenue from the sale of alcohol
<b>SIZE/SCOPE OF ISSUE (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)</b>	In the previous fiscal year, 100% of The Duppy Share's revenue was earned from the sale of alcohol
<b>IMPACT ON STAKEHOLDERS</b>	Alcohol may have a negative impact on the health and well-being of individuals and their communities
<b>IMPLEMENTED MGT PRACTICES</b>	<p>Company complies with all regulations and laws within the operating jurisdiction and in the jurisdictions they supply to.</p> <p>The company has relevant certificates including the Alcohol Wholesaler Registration Scheme (AWRS) Certificate and the Warehouse Keepers and Owners of Warehoused Goods Regulations (WOWGR) Certificate.</p> <p>Duppy Share employees receive training induction, on laws around the sale of alcohol in the jurisdiction the company operates. Employees are instructed to operate the Challenge 25 policy when sampling alcohol and anyone who looks visually underage without ID is refused a drink.</p> <p>To avoid the sale of alcohol to minors, the company ensures that anyone who appears to be under 25 should be asked for ID and only if they present an ID proving they are 18 or older, can alcohol be served to them.</p> <p>In addition, the company practices a 'No ID No Sale' policy; If consumers cannot provide a reliable ID to verify their age, then under no circumstances can they be sold alcohol.</p> <p>Besides training employees on mitigating the sales of alcohol to underage individuals, the company also provides comprehensive training on identifying and mitigating Proxy Sales (where an adult - person over 18, purchases alcohol on behalf of an underage person).</p> <p>Duppy Share also emphasizes on the social responsibility such as promoting responsible drinking and sensible/moderate drinking practices and ensuring that employees are able to identify drunk individuals to avoid risks and harm.</p>
