Background checks include a review of public records, news sources, and search engines for company names, brands, executives/founders, and other relevant topics.

Sensitive issues identified through background checks may or may not be within the scope of questions in the Disclosure Questionnaire, but undergo the same review process and are subject to the same possible review by the Standards Advisory Council, including ineligibility for B Corp Certification, required remediation, or disclosure.

#### **B Lab's Public Complaints Process**

Any party may submit a complaint about a current B Corp through B Lab's Public Complaint Process. Grounds for complaint include:

- Intentional misrepresentation of practices, policies, and/or claimed outcomes during the company's certification process
- 2) Breaches of the B Corp Community's core values as expressed in our Declaration of Interdependence

Summary of Issue	DRAGON COLOMBIA SAS has clients in the following industries: Mining, Pharmaceutical, and Fossil-Fuel.
	The company provides Industrial Cleaning Services such as high-vacuum service, cleaning of reservoirs, grease traps, septic tanks, and final disposal of water and sludge.
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	In the last fiscal year, 28.5% of the company's annual revenue was from clients in the mining industry, 0.19% from the pharmaceutical industry, and 23.2% from the fossil-fuel industry.
Impact on Stakeholders	Companies that work with clients in controversial industries can directly or indirectly increase the harmful impact to stakeholders by enabling business growth. Therefore, companies that work with clients in these industries should have practices in place to ensure that their impact is aimed at decreasing the negative impacts of the industry.
	Companies offering certain types of services and products to controversial clients are required to have at a minimum a grievance/complaints mechanism and a whistleblower protection policy.
Implemented Management Practices	B Lab has been able to verify that the company has the necessary mechanisms in place to manage the risks related to its business relationships with clients in controversial and ineligible industries, in line with B Lab's requirements (see link below). This includes:

### Disclosure Questionnaire Category: Accidental Hazardous Discharge

DRAGON COLOMBIA SAS reported that it had two accidents in the last 5 years. Accidental hazardous discharge poses significant risks to both the company responsible for the discharge and the surrounding communities. Exposure to hazardous substances released during the discharge can pose immediate health risks to workers and residents. Accidental discharge can cause extensive damage to the environment, including contamination of soil, water bodies, and air. This pollution can harm ecosystems, wildlife, and vegetation, disrupt local habitats, and contaminate food and water sources. Certified B Corps must make their involvement in the industry transparent under their B Corp Profile.
