Disclosure Questionnaire Category: Biodiversity and/or Monoculture

Topic	Company has suppliers located in Conflict Zones
Summary of Issue	The company sells roasted coffee and buys green coffee directly from farmers located in DR Congo, Honduras, Guatemala and El Salvador. These countries are listed as conflict zones in FY25 List of Fragile and Conflict-affected Situations and Global Conflict Tracker. Their only other activity in the region is an extension of green coffee buying, including the creation and support of the new Best of Congo coffee competition, as well as providing support for local charities and orphanages.
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	The following are the % of the company's purchases that came from each conflict zone in the last fiscal year: - DR Congo (0.5%) - Honduras (7%) - Guatemala (2%) - El Salvador (0.04%)
Impact on Stakeholder(s)	Business activities located in conflict zones are considered high-risk as they are more likely to cause or contribute to the conflict and/or sociopolitical instability.
	Countries classified as conflict zones are more likely to have a weak rule-of-law or a corrupt judicial system, which could undermine the effectiveness of operational grievance mechanisms for these businesses and their suppliers. In addition, the safety of the company's workers and other potential human rights violations are at risk.
Implemented Management Practices	All farms the company works with are internally audited within every 24 month period. Each farm is subject to and has signed and returned the supplier code of conduct agreement.
	They work with bodies that are able to confirm direct receipt of funds locally and where there is risk of these being diverted, they review payment channels or entire relationships. Through this review period, this exact practice caused them to divert purchasing away from Ethiopia.
