Disclosure Questionnaire Statement

Disclosure Questionnaire Category: Industries at Risk of Human Rights Violations

Topic	Forced labor related to the production of polysilicon
Summary of Issue	Purpose Capital is an equity investing company based in New Zealand. The company invests in renewable energy generation projects, including companies who are building agrivoltaic solar farms. One of the company's portfolio clients was supplying polysilicon raw materials from a supplier located in the Xinjiang region (NorthWest region in China). This region is well known for forced labour allegations related to Muslim minority groups. The company's client is no longer working with suppliers related to Xinjiang province.
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	The company does not purchase polysilicon directly, nor produce solar panels. The company's revenue is generated as a % of funds under management paid by its investors, and does not come from the portfolio companies themselves. Currently, the company does not have revenue that could be related to Xinjiang province.
Impact on Stakeholder(s)	Solar panel's supply chain, due to the reliance on polysilicon manufacturing in Xinjiang region, is a high-risk industry due to human rights violations against Uyghurs and other Muslim minorities. The human rights violations include the use of Uyghur and other Muslims minorities as workforce in the so-called "re-education" camps. These workers are subjected to various forms of abuse, including physical and psychological, long working hours, and poor living conditions. Despite several pieces of evidence about the issue, the topic remains a serious concern for international trade. The international community faces limitations to carrying out effective due diligence in the Xinjiang region, meaning traditional supply chain monitoring is insufficient to avoid or mitigate this issue. This has led to efforts such as the Coalition to End Uyghur Forced Labor, calling for a complete exit of the region.
Implemented Management Practices	As part of the management practices to select its portfolio companies, Purpose Capital implements ESG criteria and only invests in companies that have a measurable positive sustainability impact. The company has a Responsible Investing



Policy that includes the following strategies:

- 1. Screening: the application of rules based on defined criteria that determine whether an investment is permissible.
- 2. ESG integration: ongoing consideration of ESG factors within an investment analysis and decision-making process with the aim to improve risk-adjusted returns.
- 3. Thematic investing: selecting assets to access specified trends. In Purpose Capital case, the focus areas are chosen for their importance and urgency and based on research studies in the Bay of Plenty, East Cape, and Waikato, and the deep sector experience of the board, investment committee, and Limited Partners (particularly the regional trusts).
- 4. Stewardship: The use of investor rights and influence to protect and enhance overall long-term value for clients and beneficiaries, including the common economic, social and environmental assets on which their interests depend.
- 5. Impact investing: investing with the intention to generate a positive, measurable social and/or environmental impact alongside a financial return.

Purpose Capital also has an Exclusion List to exclude investments related to, involving, supporting, or promoting:

- manufacturing of tobacco or related products
- gambling, casinos and equivalent enterprises
- extractive industries (e.g. mining of minerals or other geological materials, water bottling, oil and gas)
- the use of child labour, forced or compulsory labour, or other human right abuses
- any form of discrimination based on race, culture, gender, sexual orientation, or other prohibited grounds
- items that are illegal in the country in which the good or service is used or intended to be used
- materially adverse impacts on the climate or environment any type of weapon
- adult entertainment
