- Intentional misrepresentation of practices, policies, and/or claimed outcomes during the company's certification process

Issue Date	Ongoing
Topic	Company produces and sells alcohol products
Summary of Issue	Sipsmith is a gin manufacturer that earns a material amount of revenue from the sale of alcohol
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	In the previous fiscal year, 100% of Sipsmith's revenue was earned from the sale of alcohol
Impact on Stakeholders	Alcohol may have a negative impact on the health and well-being of individuals and their communities
Implemented Management Practices	Sipsmith complies with all regulations and laws related to the sale of alcohol in the UK where it operates, and all laws and regulations in other countries in which it sells its products.  Bottles of Sipsmith's alcohol are labeled with nutritional information, including alcoholic units per serving, and have a symbol with a pregnant woman drinking with a line through the symbol to discourage alcohol consumption while pregnant.  Sipsmith requests consumers to 'Sip responsibly' and provide a link to DRINKAWARE.co.uk for further health information and guidance. Drinkaware is an independent charity working to help people make better choices about drinking and reduce alcohol misuse and harm in the UK. Additionally, Sipsmith's website links to DRINKSMART.com, which is Beam Suntory's platform to communicate with legal drinking age adults about making informed, responsible choices.

Disclosure Questionnaire Category: Environmentally Intensive Industries - Water Intensive Industries

Issue Date	Ongoing
Topic	Water Intensive Industries
Summary of Issue	As a distillery, Sipsmith Ltd operates in an industry that is water intensive. Aspects of the industry that make it water intensive include cooling, cleaning, filling processes.
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	In the previous fiscal year, 100% revenue was earned from the sale of alcohol. Sipsmith's onsite water intensity for 2020 was approximately 5 liters water per liter of pure alcohol, for cooling, cleaning and filling requirements.
Impact on Stakeholders	As a water intensive industry, alcohol production poses risks such as water stress or depletion of local water sources if water use is not appropriately managed. In the case of Sipsmith, water is sourced from mains water supply, provided by Thames Water.
Implemented Management Practices	Sipsmith monitors distillery water consumption relative to Liters of Alcohol Produced (LPA) and has targets in place to reduce consumption - 15% absolute reduction in water intensity by 2030.
	In 2019, Sipsmith installed a larger capacity chiller which allowed Sipsmith to move away from an open cooling system (water from mains source) to a closed loop cooling system for all 3 of Sipsmith's stills. This saved up to 6 million liters of water being used per year since installation. Further to this, Sipsmith has installed water batching systems to better control water used for cooling, filling and cleaning.
	Stakeholder impact is managed by the mains water supplier. However, Sipsmith is going to complete a watershed assessment of water supply to better understand any impact on stakeholders.
