Disclosure Questionnaire Category: Litigation, Arbitration, and/or Penalties

Issue Date	Ongoing
Topic	Litigation/ Arbitration related to labor issues
Summary of Issue	Labor suits involve a range of actions filed by former employees and third parties relating to, among other things, unjustified dismissal, collection of labor benefits, workplace accident. 49 cases are related to unjustified dismissal and collection of labor benefits (3 pending and 46 closed), 8 cases related to labor protection (2 pending and 6 closed), 5 cases related to self-dismissals (all closed), 4 cases related to work accidents (1 pending and 7 closed) and 1 case related to anti-union practice (closed). A large part of the layoffs were carried out in the subsidiary Servicios Integrales de Seguridad SpA. Of the 6 pending cases, there is only one case pending in 2022 and 5 corresponding to 2023.
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	In the last five years (from 2019 to May 2023), the organization has had 67 cases of labor litigation. The total projected payment of pending cases represents 0.0179% of accumulated revenue from 2019 to June 2023. In the last five years: - 49 are related to unjustified dismissal and collection of labor benefits: 3 pending (0.00263% of the accumulated revenue) and 46 closed (0.0351% of the accumulated revenue) - 8 under labor protection: 2 pending (0.0151% of accumulated revenue) and 6 closed (0.0205% of accumulated revenue) - 5 self-dismissals all closed (0.0083% of accumulated revenue) - 4 work accidents: 1 pending (0.00124% of accumulated revenue) - 1 for anti-union practice closed (0,0014% of accumulated revenue)
Impact on Stakeholders	The primary impact related to labor litigation is a financial impact on former employees and employees.
Resolution	Cases related to unjustified dismissal resulted in verdicts against the company, and 65 cases related to unjustified dismissal, collection of unpaid labor dues, workplace accidents,



	and sexual harassment are still pending.
Implemented Management Practices	A human resources management team associated with the subsidiary Servicios Integrales de Seguridad SpA was assigned. Megacentro's legal area was strengthened to deal with unjustified dismissals, and the company's internal regulations were updated.

Disclosure Questionnaire Category: Animal Products and Services

Topic	Company has direct control over animals as part of their security operations
Summary of Issue	The company has dogs in some of its centers as part of the security services it provides.
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	In 2022 there were 21 dogs in total, distributed in 7 facilities. As of 2023, Red Megacentro has only 4 dogs, which are located in Megacentro Carrascal facility.
Impact on Stakeholders	The use of dogs as a security measure is commonly used and can be of concern if the animals do not receive the appropriate veterinary treatment, disease prevention, appropriate shelter, management, nutrition, and handling.
Implemented Management Practices	The company is committed to the concern, good treatment and care of dogs, by having a veterinarian who follows up on all care processes, vaccinations and controls, ensuring the well-being of each one of them. In addition, the company has two people in charge of visiting the dogs daily, with the aim of giving them a walk, feeding and cleaning them. Lastly, they have a staff of 28 canine guards/handlers who were trained by a certified trainer. The dogs are monitored by veterinary staff which carries out checks with the aim of identifying any problems. So if their health and well-being is affected, their recovery is prioritized. Starting in 2024, the company's goal is to not have dogs, giving as a gift to a family or person who needs and wants to have dogs.
