



## DISCLOSURE MATERIALS

This component does not affect the company's score on the B Impact Assessment. If the company answers affirmatively to any items in the Disclosure Questionnaire and B Lab deems them to be material, the company must:

- 1) Be transparent about the disclosure issues identified on the company's public B Impact Report
- 2) Describe how the company has addressed this issue.
- 3) Demonstrate that management systems are in place to avoid similar issues from arising in the future.

<b>SUMMARY OF ISSUE</b>	As a agricultural company, Servicios Agromostazal operates in an industry in which biodiversity impact is a material environmental issue.
<b>SIZE/SCOPE OF ISSUE</b> (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	Approximately 50% of Servicios Agromostazal's supplier expenses come directly from farms.  89% of revenue comes from the sale of packaged fruits and nuts, and 11% of revenue comes from farming services such as harvesting, pruning, and vine formation.
<b>IMPACT ON STAKEHOLDERS</b>	Agriculture poses a risk to local ecosystems of flora and fauna as well as the potential degradation of cultivated land.
<b>IMPLEMENTED MGT PRACTICES</b>	Servicio Agromostazal is Rainforest Alliance certified (for packaging and handling), as are the majority of its suppliers. They conduct on-site visits of their suppliers to review the quality and safety of the fruit. Since 2014, the company has an environmental management system, which is focused on ensuring legal requirements regarding packaging is met, minimizing the overall environmental impact, and measuring and controlling risks identified in the contaminant analysis from waste generation. The company's food safety system includes a Pesticide Residue Monitoring Protocol that helps it to control chemical hazards that may occur in the product due to improper accumulation of any substance that exceeds the Maximum Residue Levels (MRLs) of the destination country.

<b>SIZE/SCOPE OF ISSUE</b> (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	<p>Approximately 50% of Servicios Agromostazal's supplier expenses come directly from farms.</p> <p>89% of revenue comes from the sale of packaged fruits and nuts, and 11% of revenue comes from farming services such as harvesting, pruning, and vine formation.</p>
<b>IMPACT ON STAKEHOLDERS</b>	<p>As a water intensive industry, agriculture poses risks such as water stress or depletion of local water sources if water use is not appropriately managed.</p> <p>In the last decade, Chile has gone through the worst drought on record. Water availability has steadily decreased, especially in the central and northern areas of the country.</p>
<b>IMPLEMENTED MGT PRACTICES</b>	<p>Servicio Agromostazal visits suppliers on site. Suppliers have water storage reservoirs, which enables them to accumulate an average of 75 thousand m3 of irrigation water. The suppliers all use drip technology and are also investing in technological resources (e.g., irrigation probes and satellite images) in order to further reduce the consumption of irrigation water.</p>
