Topic	Forced labor, child labor, and human trafficking risks in cocoa/chocolate industry
Summary of Issue	Allo Simone Ltd is a cacao based product manufacturer that sources cacao beans and cacao butter from companies in cacao producing countries: Kablon Farm, Philippines; Zorzal, Dominican Republic; Agloforesta Comunitario Mexico Organic, Jaguar, and Cocoa from Mexico, Mexico; Maya Mountain, Belize, and Ecuador.
	The company also works with companies that trade directly with farmers at different countries of origin (Uncommon Cacao, Cocoa Supply).
	Some of these producers produce the cacao beans in their own farms and the others work together with farmers, trading wet beans directly with them in order to make the post harvest process and their facilities.
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	100% of the company's cocoa purchases can be traced back to the farmer.
Impact on Stakeholders	The global cocoa industry has a history of forced and child labor, which subjects workers to poor working conditions, low wages, and puts children at risk for human trafficking.
Implemented Management Practices	The company states that when it is unable to ensure that there are no risks involved, their main practice is to switch suppliers and only engage in commercial relations with companies that can trace the origin of their raw materials. The company changed their cocoa powder supplier to Cocoa Supply, a company that operates under the same ethical and environmental principles. The company has transitioned from conventional cocoa powder to an organic and traceable alternative. The company uses an electronic invoice system that is fully traceable with the Ecuadorian IRS, and pay farmers through bank transfers to allow for easy auditing. Their products include a lot of numbers that are fully traceable to the cacao farm used to produce each one of the batches. The company began purchasing beans from Uncommon Cacao,



a B Corp Certified company that trades cacao beans with farmers across the globe. They provide their customers with a Transparency Report, which details information about the people, age, and gender of those involved in producing each type of bean.

The company's cocoa suppliers of cacao beans and cacao butter from companies in cacao producing companies do not have ethical certifications yet work close to communities in order to achieve social impacts and ethical ways of trading cacao, including ecosystem restoration focused practices, promotion of traditional agroforestry systems and sustainable production methods.
