Issue Date	September 2021 & May 2023
Topic	Recalls due to mandatory recalls
Summary of Issue	Danone Central Eastern Europe has had two mandatory recalls in the last five years due to food contamination and foreign objects.
	Recall 1: Hami Cereals (Czech Republic & Slovakia) Issue Date: September 2021 Routine in-market sampling by authority finds Salmonella enteritis in Hami Banana Cereal. Authority issues recall notice and RASFF before receiving company's information. Production records, including Salmonella testing, are in conformity with authority sampling in the Opole factory. Therefore, no evidence of Salmonella contamination.
	Recall 2: Oikos Case (Hungary) Issue date: March-May 2023 A consumer notified the National Food Safety Chain Authority about a mould case in a blueberry cheesecake. Based on the notification, in the following day during inspection by the Authority, a moldy product was also found in the same product's batch. Authority initiated official procedure and recall was required.
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	Recall 1: Hami Cereals (Czech Republic & Slovakia) Retailer returned the batch to Consumer Business Unit (CBU). This represented 0.13% of the company's total revenues. No illness or injury was reported.
	Recall 2: Oikos Case (Hungary) 718 euros fine imposed by local authority. No illness or injury was reported.
Impact on Stakeholders	Recall 1: Hami Cereals (Czech Republic & Slovakia) - Salmonella contamination poses a severe risk to consumers which resulted in no consumer illness and injury reported from the episode No evidence of contamination was found RASFF alert (EU FS notification platform)
	Recall 2: Oikos Case (Hungary)



	 Foreign object poses a severe risk to consumers which resulted in no consumer illness and injury reported from the episode. RASFF alert (EU FS notification platform)
Implemented Management Practices	Recall 1: Hami Cereals (Czech Republic & Slovakia) Recalls were made in Czech Republic & Slovakia and customer complaints were monitored. The company followed all the corrective actions as requested by the authorities. Recall 2: Oikos Case (Hungary) All relevant products were taken down from shelves, documentation was submitted to Authorities, and no new complaints were registered. There was internal alignment to improve processes and prevent similar cases.
