

DISCLOSURE MATERIALS

Certified B Corporations must complete a Disclosure Questionnaire to identify potentially sensitive issues related to the company (e.g. historical fines, sanctions, material litigation, or sensitive industry practices).

This component does not affect the company's score on the B Impact Assessment. If the company answers affirmatively to any items in the Disclosure Questionnaire and B Lab deems them to be material, the company must:

- 1) Be transparent about the disclosure issues identified on the company's public B Impact Report
- 2) Describe how the company has addressed this issue.
- 3) Demonstrate that management systems are in place to avoid similar issues from arising in the future.

In all cases, the Standards Advisory council reserves the right to refuse certification if the company is ultimately deemed not to uphold the spirit of the community.

In addition to the voluntary indication of sensitive issues in the Disclosure Questionnaire, companies pursuing Certification also are subject to background checks by B Lab staff. Background checks include a review of public records, news sources, and search engines for company names, brands, executives/founders, and other relevant topics.

Sensitive issues identified through background checks may or may not be within the scope of questions in the Disclosure Questionnaire, but undergo the same review process and are subject to the same possible review by the Standards Advisory Council, including ineligibility for B Corp Certification, required remediation, or disclosure.

TOPIC	Labor Litigation
SUMMARY OF ISSUE	Labor suits involve a range of actions filed mostly by employees whose claims are related to dismissal.
SIZE/SCOPE OF ISSUE (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	As of 2022, Draeger International had 17 closed labor litigation. The financial value of these lawsuits was approximately 499,000 euros. Currently, there are 7 pending labor litigation and the total amount claimed in said proceedings is approximately 372,000 euros.
IMPACT ON STAKEHOLDERS	The primary impact related to labor litigation is a financial impact on employees.
RESOLUTION	Among the labor litigation cases reported,17(5 ruled against the company and 12 settled) were closed and 7 have not yet been judged.
MANAGEMENT PRACTICES	 In order to remediate the labor-related matters and/or prevent them from happening again, Draeger International has implemented the following practices: Company, internally alert the employee to any discrepancies between its expectations and the employee's contribution at an earlier stage. To achieve that, the company conducts weekly reviews, quarterly end-of-cycle interviews, and interviews with the HR department. Annual appraisal interviews also allow Draeger International to assess the level of contribution of the employee versus its expectations. Draeger International tries to resolve disputes amicably by proposing a negotiated departure. This provision is aligned with the government regulations and is called the conventional rupture.
