

DISCLOSURE MATERIALS

Certified B Corporations must complete a Disclosure Questionnaire to identify potentially sensitive issues related to the company (e.g. historical fines, sanctions, material litigation, or sensitive industry practices).

This component does not affect the company's score on the B Impact Assessment. If the company answers affirmatively to any items in the Disclosure Questionnaire and B Lab deems them to be material, the company must:

- 1) Be transparent about the disclosure issues identified on the company's public B Impact Report
- 2) Describe how the company has addressed this issue.
- 3) Demonstrate that management systems are in place to avoid similar issues from arising in the future.

Sensitive issues identified through background checks may or may not be within the scope of questions in the Disclosure Questionnaire, but undergo the same review process and are subject to the same possible review by the Standards Advisory Council, including ineligibility for B Corp Certification, required remediation, or disclosure.

TOPIC	Noise 13 Design provides graphic design services to some clients in the cannabis industry.
SUMMARY OF ISSUE	Noise 13 provides graphic design services such as logo design, messaging, brand positioning, packaging design and website design. Some of their clients work in the regulated cannabis industry. Where the company carries out packaging design for these clients, they work with the Client's legal team to be sure all messaging on the packaging complies with each state's regulation.
SIZE/SCOPE OF ISSUE (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	The company has typically worked with 2-3 clients in the cannabis space per year. Cannabis Clients account for 5-10% of Noise 13 Design Revenue per year.
IMPACT ON STAKEHOLDERS	The company only works with cannabis clients that operate in states where cannabis is legalized and heavily regulated.
IMPLEMENTED MGT PRACTICES	The company provides flat rate contracts (majority of their work) and hourly contracts (for ongoing support). They do not work with any other clients in controversial industries. They do not have a formal process for screening new clients but during the new business phase, they assess their clients on business practices both around products, staff and customers. They do not manage their client's advertising or social media marketing. They only provide branding, packaging, and website options and follow all local regulations. So far they have only worked with brands in California and review the updates to packaging and website regulations before and during each project in case they change. They also select the most sustainable materials the client can afford on their projects as Cannabis is an overall packaged product for child safety. The company does not sell or manufacture packing, but work with those legal suppliers to provide the graphics that are applied to those structures. They train all staff that work with a Cannabis or Alcohol brand to review the required current regulation before working on that project. They direct staff to the State guidelines vs having a separate training since the info changes regularly. They also do not allow designers who are underage (interns) to work on any cannabis projects
