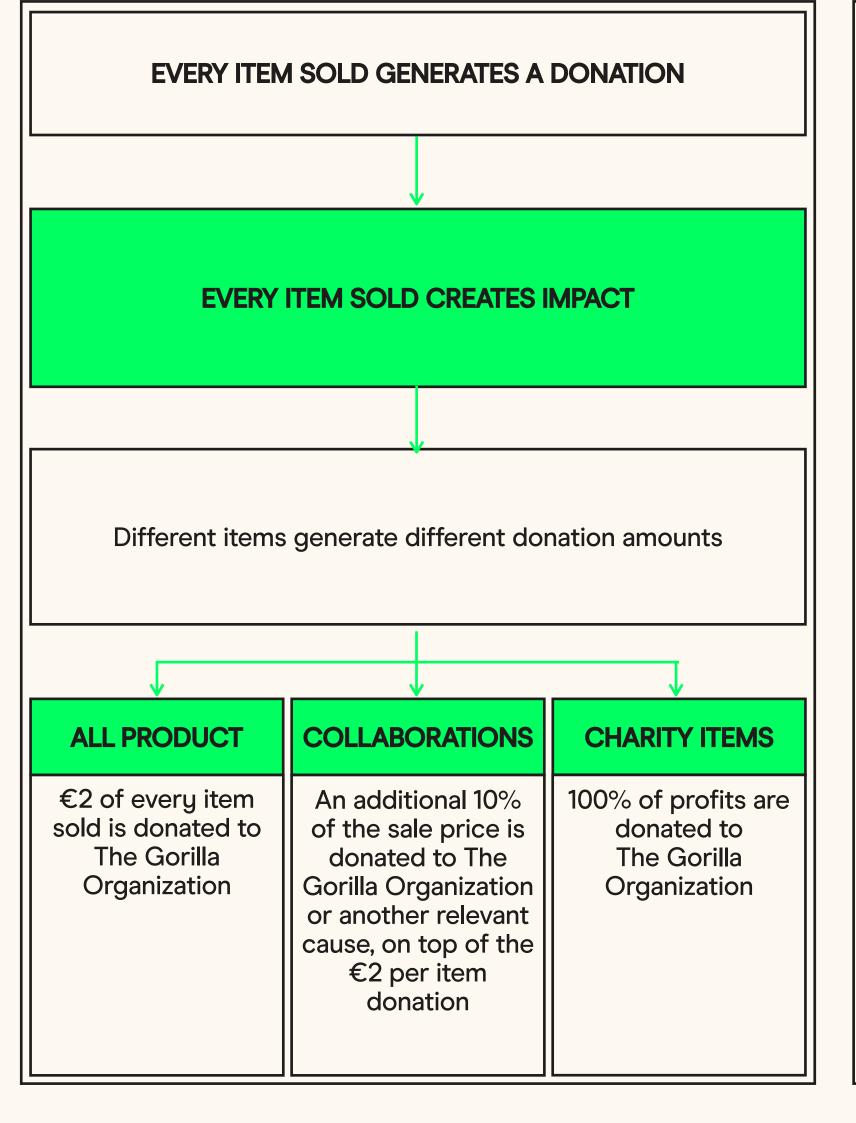

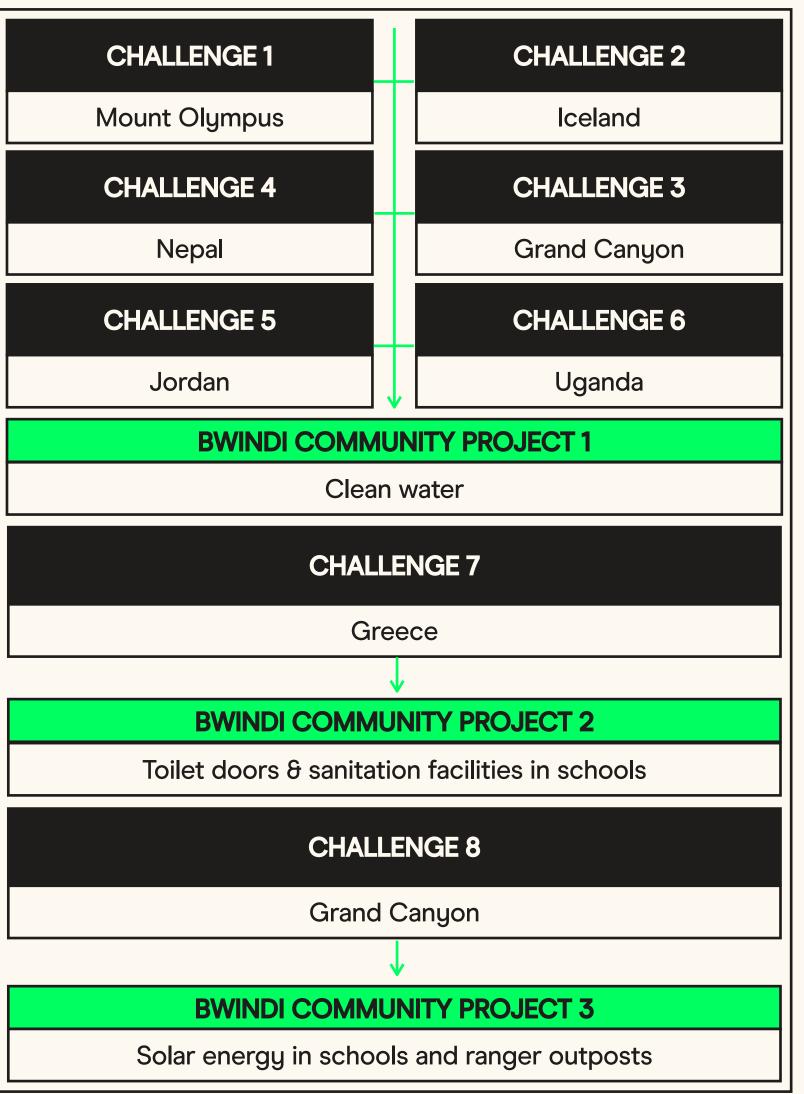

SUMMARY

HOW DID 2024 GO?

IN 2024, WE DEEPENED OUR COMMITMENT TO MEANINGFUL CHANGE THROUGH OUR PILLARS OF ADAPTIVE INNOVATION, COLLECTIVE EMPOWERMENT, AND SUSTAINABLE REGENERATION.

These pillars continue to guide our purpose-driven approach, merging lifestyle with tangible conservation work while fostering a culture that unites our troop, partners, and customers around shared values of progress and impact.

Adaptive Innovation shaped our journey through purposeful design, functional upgrades, and open access. Our Ranger jackets were introduced using durable ripstop fabric, designed for utility, longevity, and exploration. Adventures For A Cause evolved into openparticipation challenges, welcoming supporters from around the world to contribute, move, and raise funds in their own way. This year's eighth adventure took our troop through the remote and rugged Kanab Creek Wilderness in the Grand Canyon, raising €28,000 to deliver solar energy to two schools and a ranger post in Bwindi. Storytelling remained a powerful tool, with MAJI and The Hearts of Bwindi continuing to receive international recognition across festival circuits, reaffirming the role of honest narratives in driving awareness.

Collective Empowerment thrived in 2024. We returned to Uganda with members of our troop for an experiential journey rooted in understanding and connection. From community runs across cities to a dynamic collaboration

with Percival in the UK, our movement became more accessible and inclusive. Internally, our team expanded and grew stronger. Externally, our presence at Sneakerness Festival reinforced our position as a brand built on purpose, creativity, and community.

Through Sustainable Regeneration, we impacted over 27,000 people across more than 30 communities in Uganda, expanding efforts in water access, solar energy, and education. Alongside our internal initiatives, we also collaborated with Tatoi Club to fund the installation of two 10,000-litre water tanks in Nyamasinda village, further supporting clean water access for communities near gorilla habitats. Our operations moved closer to a zero harm model, improving practices across sourcing and production. With the introduction of more community-first initiatives such as local runs and regional activations, we proved that regeneration starts both in the field and within our own systems.

2024 was a year of openness, connection, and resilience. Through our products, our platforms, and our people, we continued to prove that style and substance can coexist, and that every step we take together leaves a lasting impact.

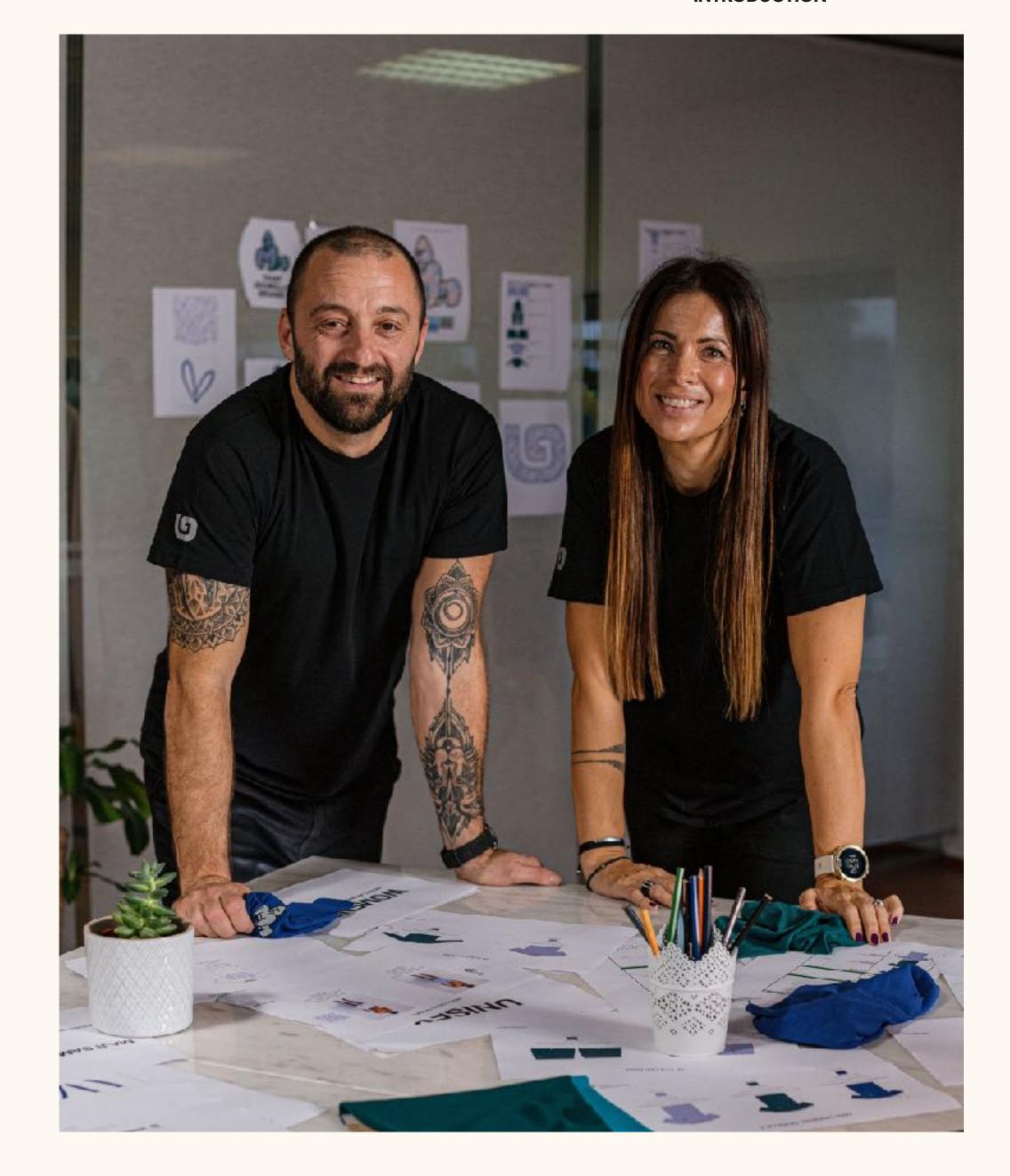
Through everything, MAJI and The Hearts of Bwindi continued to spark awareness and recognition around the world, proving that storytelling, when rooted in truth, travels far.

Applying this framework to That Gorilla Brand means we are focused on engaging in actions that are not only beneficial to the human communities that surround gorillas habitats. We are also setting standards and practices that inspire others to have a positive impact on nature habitats.

CREATING CONDITIONS FOR OTHERS TO DO GOOD

We are not just internally focused on doing good, but it is also setting up an environment or a system where other entities, like partners, customers, or even competitors, are encouraged or facilitated to engage in positive actions.

This could be through collaborative projects, setting industry standards, providing resources or platforms for others, or advocating for beneficial policies.

RESPONSIBLE MANUFACTURING

We strengthened our manufacturing criteria in 2024, continuing our collaboration with RTG in Portugal while setting even higher standards for all new production partners. Every garment was produced under strict ethical and sustainable guidelines, ensuring care for both people and the planet. We also upgraded our fulfilment process with compostable courier bags, taking a further step toward reducing our packaging footprint and aligning every stage of production with our impact values.

VISIBILITY THROUGH DESIGN

In 2024, we sharpened the way we present our collections. Our SS24 and AW24 drops highlighted essential pieces designed for real use, with t-shirts at the core and new additions like the Ranger jackets and Ranger cargos crafted from durable ripstop fabric. Each piece was created to balance functionality, durability, and everyday wearability, staying true to the needs of a conscious lifestyle.

DESIGNING FOR LIFESTYLE AND IMPACT

Beyond the products themselves, we focused on the deeper connection between clothing and purpose. Every design choice reflected a commitment to environmental and social responsibility, blending style with meaning. Through careful material selection, responsible manufacturing, and clear storytelling, we worked to inspire action and show that fashion can drive positive change.

TRANSPARENCY AT EVERY STEP

While our product tags remained unchanged, we focused on making the impact behind each product more visible across our owned channels. From updated product descriptions to purpose-driven messaging, we reinforced transparency, traceability, and trust, giving our community a clearer understanding of how and where their products are made and why every choice matters.

DOCUMENTING INSPIRATIONAL JOURNEYS

Throughout 2024, we continued to capture and share the essence of our Adventures, providing inspiration for others to engage with conservation efforts. Through storytelling rooted in authenticity, we showed how movement and purpose together can drive real change.

ADVENTURE 8: KANAB CREEK WILDERNESS

Our eighth Adventures For A Cause challenge took our troop deep into the remote and rugged Kanab Creek Wilderness in the Grand Canyon. Over four days and three nights, the team navigated extreme terrain to raise €28,000, funding solar energy installations for schools and a ranger post in Bwindi. This adventure reaffirmed the power of physical challenge to generate meaningful, lasting impact for both people and wildlife.

EXPANDING MOVEMENT THROUGH COMMUNITY RUNS

In addition to larger expeditions, we brought our message to city streets across Europe and to the communities we support in Uganda through inclusive community runs. These open events invited people from all backgrounds to move with purpose, strengthening our troop, raising awareness, and making everyday adventure a platform for positive change.

CELEBRATING MILESTONES THROUGH PRINT

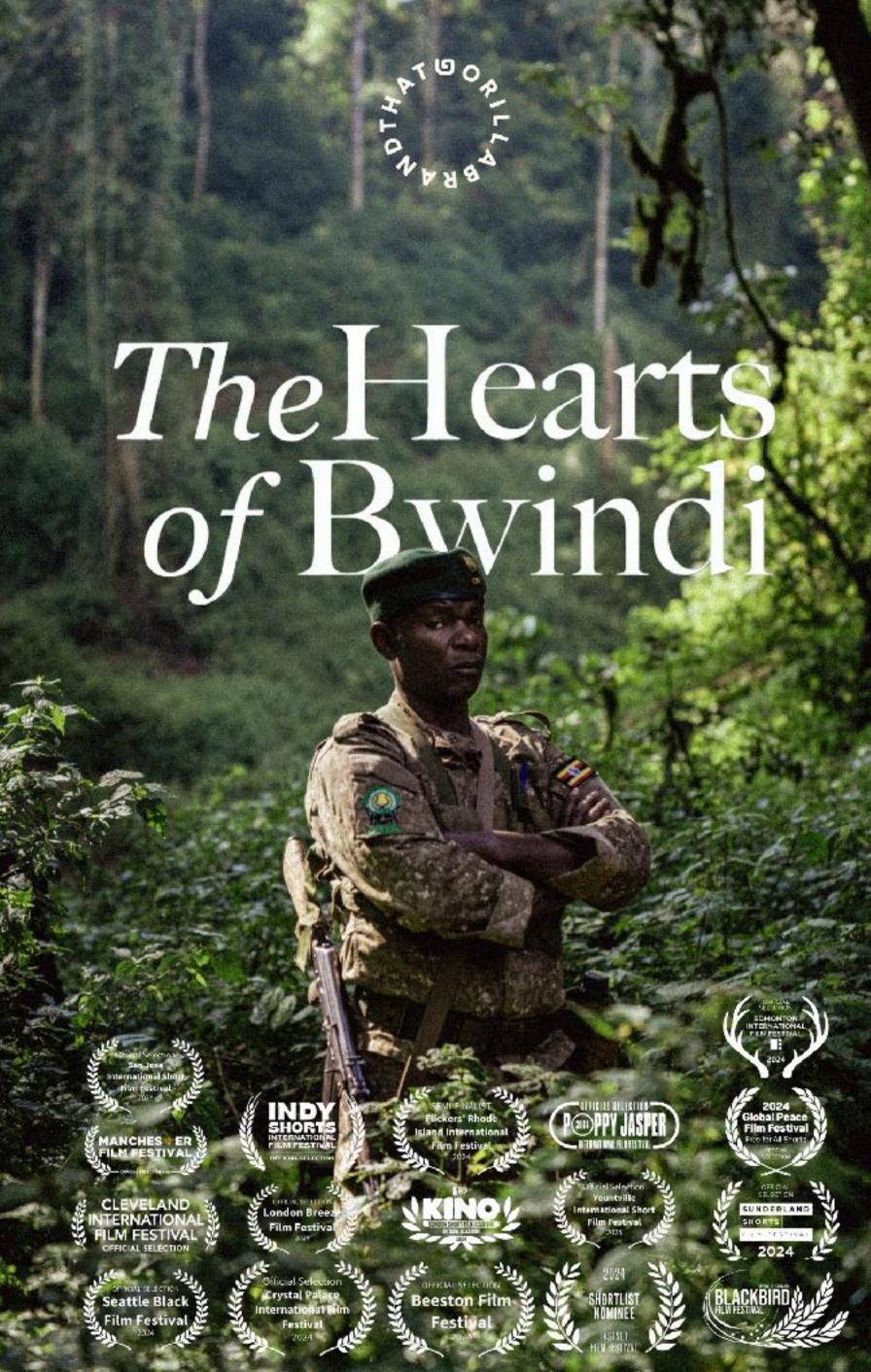

AMPLIFYING OUR VOICE

Our media activities across 2024 were designed to elevate the impact behind every project we launched. Our primary interventions aim for limitless positive impact within communities surrounding gorilla habitats in Uganda. As each project culminates, we transition to supporting new communities, ensuring our efforts are part of an evolving journey of improvement and expansion.

This continuous cycle of reaching and then setting new benchmarks allows us to extend our positive influence further, embodying a commitment to perpetual growth and adaptation in our mission to uplift human communities that surround gorilla habitats.

OUR INTERVENTIONS

WATER

We are committed to increasing access to clean, responsibly sourced water for communities living around gorilla habitats in Uganda. Our efforts go beyond conservation, supporting long-term wellbeing and resilience by improving the availability of one of life's most essential resources.

FUNDRAISING VEHICLE: ADVENTURES AND FILM

In 2024, we expanded our clean water initiatives across Uganda, strengthening access in both schools and local communities. In collaboration with Tatoi Club, we funded the installation of two 10,000-litre water tanks in Nyamasinda Village, helping to secure safe, daily access to water. At Nyamatsinda Primary School, our long-term efforts have resulted in more than eight 10,000-litre tanks, ensuring that students, teachers, and families have reliable water year-round.

Alongside new rainwater harvesting systems, we continued to support two community wells, ensuring

ongoing access to clean water for households in remote areas. These wells have become essential pillars of local resilience, helping families access safe water closer to home.

Today, our water initiatives support approximately 30 communities surrounding Bwindi Impenetrable National Park. Access to clean water has delivered immediate health benefits while unlocking long-term opportunities. Schools now maintain gardens that contribute to food self-sufficiency, and once-unusable swamplands like Njeganjengye have been transformed into productive farmland sustaining around 80

households. Local clinics report fewer cases of waterborne illness among children, and villagers no longer need to venture into forest streams to collect water. With reliable access to clean water, health, dignity, and resilience across these communities continue to grow.

Water access is the foundation that strengthens health, education, farming, and futures — building resilience across every community we touch.

SANITATION

In 2024, we supported the installation of new hygienic sanitation facilities at Nyamatsinda Primary School in Uganda, improving daily life for 686 students and 14 teachers. Access to proper sanitation plays a crucial role in reducing illness, improving school attendance, and creating a dignified, safe learning environment — especially for girls.

This intervention reflects our continued commitment to embedding sanitation within our broader water and education work. When schools have access to safe hygiene infrastructure, learning outcomes improve and communities become healthier and more resilient.

FUNDRAISING VEHICLE: ADVENTURES

2024 STATUS:

In 2024, we completed a full sanitation upgrade at Nyamatsinda Primary School, delivering safer and more dignified facilities for 686 students and 14 teachers. This work fulfilled the sanitation component of our 2023 fundraising goals and serves as a model for future projects across the region.

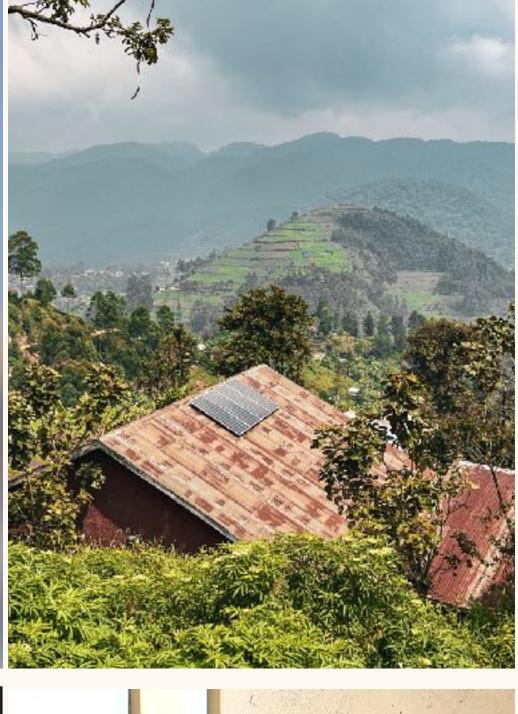
In 2024, we expanded our impact by delivering sustainable solar energy solutions to communities surrounding Bwindi National Park. Following the success of previous initiatives in water and sanitation, our focus on renewable energy marked a crucial step towards building more resilient, self-sufficient communities and supporting conservation efforts at their roots.

FUNDRAISING VEHICLE: ADVENTURES

2024 STATUS:

In May 2024, nine fundraisers completed a four-day Adventure for a Cause through the Grand Canyon, successfully raising €28,000 to bring solar energy to two schools and one ranger outpost near Bwindi National Park. These installations now provide clean, reliable power for classrooms, enabling better learning conditions and extended study hours for students, while also improving safety and operations for rangers working to protect endangered mountain gorillas. In total, the initiative benefits approximately 2,000 people and contributes to a more sustainable future for both communities and conservation efforts.





The installation of solar energy at two schools and one ranger outpost has transformed daily life for students, teachers, and conservation teams near Bwindi National Park. Reliable power has enabled longer study hours, improved classroom environments, and created new opportunities for digital learning. At the ranger outpost, access to sustainable energy supports patrols, research, and the protection of gorilla habitats.

Beyond the immediate benefits to education and conservation work, the installation of solar systems helps reduce reliance on environmentally damaging energy sources, lowering human pressure on the park itself. By supporting sustainable practices, this project directly contributes to the long-term preservation of endangered mountain gorillas and the protection of one of the world's most important ecosystems.

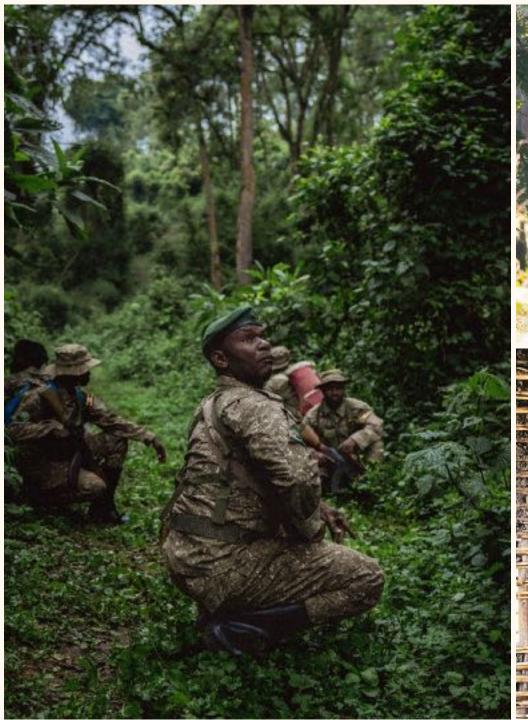


EDUCATION

Supporting Community Development and Conservation

Our donations support the advancement of learning, development, and conservation within Bwindi communities. With the support of our donations, The Gorilla Organization leads a range of initiatives including ranger support and training, organic farming education, reformed poacher reintegration, gorilla-friendly beekeeping, tree planting, and conservation education projects. These initiatives spread the message of environmental stewardship across Central and East Africa, connecting conservation with opportunity for future generations.

2024 STATUS:

In 2024, our partnership with The Gorilla Organization continued to drive meaningful change, expanding our focus on water access, sanitation, solar energy, and education within communities surrounding gorilla habitats. Our collaboration supported projects that improved immediate health and living conditions while equipping community members with the skills needed for long-term resilience and sustainability.

We expanded access to clean water, delivered solar energy to two schools and a ranger outpost, and strengthened educational opportunities through improved infrastructure and resources. Our Adventures for a Cause also reached new heights, with a diverse troop completing a four-day trek through the remote Kanab Creek Wilderness in the Grand Canyon to raise funds for these initiatives. Navigating rugged canyon crossings and demanding terrain, the team demonstrated the power of collective action in supporting both human communities and mountain gorilla conservation efforts.

Recognising that education is the foundation for lasting change, we are taking our commitment even further. In 2025, we will embark on one of our most ambitious projects yet. We will build a primary school from the ground up in Uganda. This project will provide essential learning facilities and create a new centre for opportunity, resilience, and conservation leadership within the community.

In the communities we support, education already extends far beyond the classroom. Schools play an active role in conservation, where students engage in reforestation efforts, lead local waste clean-up initiatives, and raise awareness about protecting their natural environment. These hands-on experiences help young people connect knowledge to action, building a new generation of leaders grounded in responsibility, resilience, and care for the world around them.

These milestones reflect our belief that sustainable development, environmental stewardship, and education must move forward together. Together with our partners and supporters, we are building the foundations for a more resilient and empowered future.

OUR INTERVENTIONS

EDUCATION

Sam, a local athlete and community leader in Kisoro, sees the potential in the youth of his community. With the right guidance, he believes young people can rise above the distractions that often pull them away from positive paths.

Through his Running with Sam initiative, he designed a programme that blends physical training with education. Early each morning, as the sun rises over the misty mountains, groups of young runners gather — not only to push their physical limits but also to learn. After the runs, they dive into critical topics like voter education, human rights, and environmental conservation.

The impact of Running with Sam goes beyond fitness and knowledge. It builds a sense of responsibility, empowerment, and community service. By leading his troop of runners into action within their villages, Sam is creating a model of change — a reminder that when local leadership and global support meet, real transformation happens.









OUR UNDERLYING INTERVENTIONS

In 2024, we continued working towards a zero harm operational model, where every aspect of our business aligns with the wellbeing of people and the planet. From sourcing sustainable materials to refining our production processes, we aim to minimise environmental impact while upholding the highest ethical standards.

This year, we strengthened our manufacturing partnerships, introduced compostable courier bags in our fulfilment process, and raised expectations across our supply chain to ensure that care, responsibility, and transparency remain at the core of everything we do. Building a responsible brand is an ongoing journey, and every decision brings us closer to our long term vision of impact without compromise.

PEOPLE

Ensuring the wellbeing of our workforce remains a core priority. In 2024, we maintained high standards for physical and mental health, safety, and security within our production facilities. Regular external health audits, including checks on noise, light, and temperature conditions, were conducted to ensure optimal working environments.

All That Gorilla Brand employees continue to receive fair compensation, with 100 percent of our team being paid above the Greece living wage and family living wage, alongside annual bonuses. Every employee participates in a 360-degree review process to support professional development.

This year, we further strengthened our human resources practices by implementing an anonymous employee feedback survey and introducing a dedicated HR platform. The platform allows employees to easily access policies, submit feedback, track their personal development goals, and engage with internal processes more transparently and efficiently. As our team grows, our commitment to fostering an ethical, supportive, and empowering workplace remains unwavering.

NATURE

In 2024, we continued to strengthen our commitment to minimising environmental impact across every stage of production. The majority of our products are made from organic fibres, and our trims are predominantly recycled or recyclable, reflecting our focus on responsible resource use.

All cotton used in our product manufacturing remained 100 percent organic, sourced through our trusted partner RTG.

We also expanded our commitment to circularity through our swimwear collections, which are produced using SEAQUAL yarns — fibres made from recycled plastic recovered from the ocean. By choosing materials that repurpose waste and reduce harm, we are helping protect the ecosystems that inspire everything we do.

Every product we create moves us closer to a future where fashion and conservation work hand in hand.

OUR UNDERLYING INTERVENTIONS

Our underlying interventions are designed to build a zero harm operational model, where every aspect of our business is aligned with the wellbeing of people and the planet. We work continuously to refine our practices, that from sourcing materials to final production stages, we minimise environmental impact and uphold the highest ethical standards. Every decision we make reflects our commitment to responsible growth, transparent partnerships, and a future where business can drive meaningful change.

POLLUTION

In our manufacturing process, we strictly adhere to using responsibly sourced water, which is reserved primarily for essential needs such as restrooms and drinking facilities. We ensure that all wastewater is disposed of responsibly, aligning with our sustainability principles.

We are committed to ensuring that our operations and products are free from harmful emissions and greenhouse gases. Across our adventures and media activities, we successfully offset a portion of carbon emissions incurred during travel, contributing to a cleaner, healthier environment.

2024 STATUS

- All packaging is certified to meet independent standards for environmental impact (Source: RTG)
- All packaging is non-toxic (Source: RTG)
- Compostable courier bags were introduced for online orders, further reducing plastic waste across our fulfilment process
- A plan was established to measure the Scope 1-3 emissions of our head office in Athens, with the aim to calculate and share this carbon footprint during 2024
- —We utilise freight or shipping methods with lower environmental impacts, avoiding air shipment wherever possible (Source: RTG)
- —Seventy percent of the energy used by our manufacturers comes from renewable sources, with plans to install solar panels to cover an additional thirty percent within the next year (Source: RTG)
- —All Adventures for a Cause carbon emissions have been offset through direct donations supporting conservation projects and reforestation efforts

WASTE

Our approach to waste management is rooted in circularity. All waste generated during the production of our products is recycled through certified recycling partners, ensuring responsible disposal and reuse. Additionally, our manufacturers repurpose cutting waste by transforming it into new recycled yarns, giving materials a second life and further reducing the environmental footprint of our collections.

Circular practices are at the heart of our commitment to minimising waste, conserving resources, and building a more responsible future.

2024 STATUS

- —Our products have been source reduced during the last fiscal year by decreasing the volume of material needed through improved material selection, production processes, and product design
- —Seventy-five to ninety-nine percent of materials by volume used in product and packaging production are recyclable or biodegradable (Source: RTG)

PRODUCT DESIGN UPGRADE

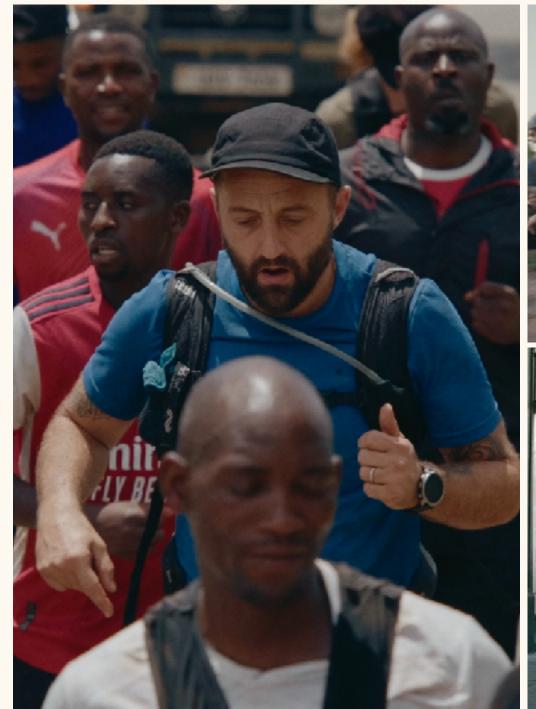

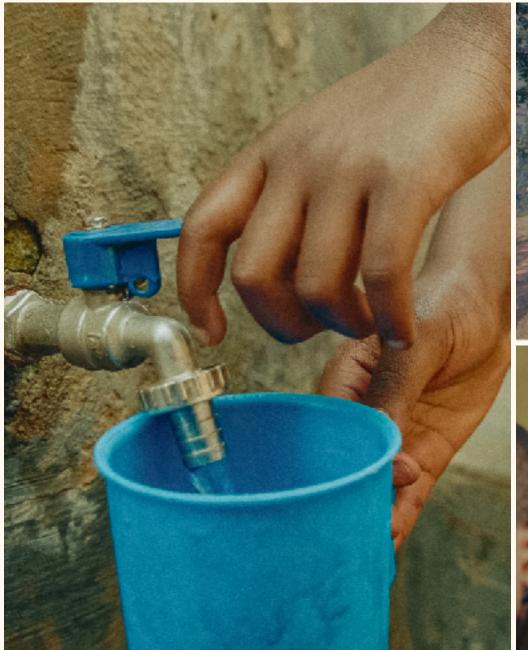
