Sensitive issues identified through background checks may or may not be within the scope of questions in the Disclosure Questionnaire, but undergo the same review process and are subject to the same possible review by the Standards Advisory Council, including ineligibility for B Corp Certification, required remediation, or disclosure.

Kingdom Community Wind (KCW) exceeded sound standards in its first quarter of operation for a total of 4.16 hours, out of more than 10,000 hours measured since the project began operating in 2012. The dBA sound limit is 45, and in those instances were increased by 1.3 dBA or less.
