

DISCLOSURE MATERIALS

Certified B Corporations must complete a Disclosure Questionnaire to identify potentially sensitive issues related to the company (e.g. historical fines, sanctions, material litigation, or sensitive industry practices).

This component does not affect the company's score on the B Impact Assessment. If the company answers affirmatively to any items in the Disclosure Questionnaire and B Lab deems them to be material, the company must:

- 1) Be transparent about the disclosure issues identified on the company's public B Impact Report
- Describe how the company has addressed this issue.
- 3) Demonstrate that management systems are in place to avoid similar issues from arising in the future.

In all cases, the Standards Advisory council reserves the right to refuse certification if the company is ultimately deemed not to uphold the spirit of the community.

In addition to the voluntary indication of sensitive issues in the Disclosure Questionnaire, companies pursuing Certification also are subject to background checks by B Lab staff. Background checks include a review of public records, news sources, and search engines for company names, brands, executives/founders, and other relevant topics.

Sensitive issues identified through background checks may or may not be within the scope of questions in the Disclosure Questionnaire, but undergo the same review process and are subject to the same possible review by the Standards Advisory Council, including ineligibility for B Corp Certification, required remediation, or disclosure.

SUMMARY OF ISSUE We contacted the temp agency, they released her and sent a new temporary worker to meet our needs. We

received a letter from the US EEOC with the claim.

We agreed to mediation and came to a resolution. The temporary worker later rescinded their agreement to the RESOLUTION terms of mediation, asking for a monetary award. While we do not admit any wrongdoing, we reached a

settlement in lieu of litigation costs.

IMPLEMENTED MGT PRACTICES

Train all managers and supervisors on reasonable accommodations, which is a practice that had already been in

place, including a focus on documentation, terminations, and difficult discussions.

REPORT Trained on July 14th, 2015. Scheduled for recurring training in November 2016.
