Sensitive issues identified through background checks may or may not be within the scope of questions in the Disclosure Questionnaire, but undergo the same review process and are subject to the same possible review by the Standards Advisory Council, including ineligibility for B Corp Certification, required remediation, or disclosure.

B Lab's Public Complaints Process

Any party may submit a complaint about a current B Corp through B Lab's Public Complaint Process. Grounds for complaint include:

- Intentional misrepresentation of practices, policies, and/or claimed outcomes during the company's certification process
- 2) Breaches of the B Corp Community's core values as expressed in our Declaration of Interdependence

Disclosure Questionnaire Category: Others - Disclosure Industries

Topic	Clients in Controversial Industries
Summary of Issue	NATIVA is a consulting firm focused in the area of social and environmental sustainability.
	The company has had clients from industries related to Bottled Water, For-profit Higher Education, Fossil Fuels (non coal/oil sands), Marketing of Breastmilk Substitutes, Mining, Pharmaceuticals and Whole life insurance products, which are deemed controversial by B Lab.
	The services offered to the clients relate to helping them incorporate social and environmental sustainability into their business operations and strategy. Their services are aimed at accelerating the transition towards regenerative economic models, supporting a business evolution in which the social and environmental factors are integrated.
	The services provided to the clients can be sold to other clients in different industries, including other both non-controversial and controversial industries.
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	As of October, the company has generated 0.38% of 2024 total revenue from clients in the for-profit higher education industry, 0.32% from clients involved in the marketing of breastmilk substitutes, 0.23% from clients in the mining industry and 22.03% from clients in the pharmaceutical industry.
	The company had last served clients in the whole life insurance products, bottled water companies and the fossil-fuel industry in 2023 and had generated 0.64%, 0.31%, and 0.16% from those industries respectively.
Impact on Stakeholders	Companies that work with clients in controversial industries can indirectly increase the harmful impact to stakeholders by enabling business growth. Therefore, companies that work with clients in these industries should have practices in place to ensure that their impact is aimed at decreasing the negative impacts of the industry.



	B Lab has flagged the involvement of companies with clients in controversial industries as a material issue and new standards will be created to address possible risks related to this matter.
Implemented Management Practices	NATIVA is selective with its clients and evaluates taking on clients from controversial industries on a case by case basis.
	The company's aim is to assess the initial impacts of these industries, and they would only continue the collaboration exclusively if a real intention to identify and implement regenerative business alternatives emerges. As NATIVA understands the challenges in determining potential clients' intention, the company is regularly working towards refining its "Ethical Compass" to make better decisions in regards to continuing with some of its clients or to discontinue the business relationship.
	NATIVA's Compass Committee and its Science team analyze the major risks and challenges of the industries that they work with and share the results of their assessments to internal stakeholders to support the business decision-making process with regards to controversial industries.
