TOPIC	Paradigm Foods is a meat wholesale/ retail company and sources >46% of their supplier expenses from animal farms
SUMMARY OF ISSUE	The company is involved in the sale of packaged meat, both purchased directly from meat processors, as well as company owned cattle and sheep processed for the company on third party establishments. The company is involved in the sale of 100% grass fed cattle and lamb, free range, antibiotic and hormone free sourced from small family farms as well as large private and public organizations.
SIZE/SCOPE OF ISSUE (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	100% of the company's revenue is derived from the sale of animal products. 46% of the company's supplier expenses are derived from purchases of cattle and sheep directly from animal farms and 11% of the company's expenses is represented by the purchase of packaged meat from meat processors. Sourcing farms have an average heard head count of 1000 (ranging from 50 to 10,000).
IMPACT ON STAKEHOLDERS	The company chooses suppliers that align with its Animal Focus Philosophy and offers a variety of brands expressing their commitment to animal welfare, ranging from grass fed to free range. Cattle farms by law are required to comply with the LPA system which includes a welfare component, and are audited annually.

SUMMARY OF ISSUE	As a meat wholesale/retail company, Paradigm Foods operates in an industry in which biodiversity impact is a material environmental issue.
SIZE/SCOPE OF ISSUE (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	Approximately 46% of Paradigm Foods' supplier expenses come directly from animal farms.
IMPACT ON STAKEHOLDERS	Animal agriculture poses a risk to local ecosystems of flora and fauna as well as the potential degradation of farmed land.
IMPLEMENTED MGT PRACTICES	Although the company has limited influence over the biodiversity impact of its suppliers, it is selective with who it chooses to do business with. Suppliers are chosen based on their values and whether they share the same values as Paradigm Foods. Grassfed Beef Program An example of the company's commitment towards the preservation of biodiversity is through their Roots Regenerative Grassfed Beef program. Roots Regenerative is 100% grassfed beef produced from cattle raised with holistic grazing methods to ultimately improve the environment. SUMMARY OF ISSUE	As a wholesale/retail company that derives all of its revenue from the sale of packaged meat and is involved in processing part of the meat it sells, Paradigm Foods operates in an industry in which energy and carbon emissions is a material environmental issue.
SIZE/SCOPE OF ISSUE (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	Approximately 46% of Paradigm Foods' supplier expenses come directly from animal farms and 11% of supplier expenses come from meat processsors.
IMPACT ON STAKEHOLDERS	Animal agriculture is a major contributor to global carbon emissions.
IMPLEMENTED MGT PRACTICES	The company has undertaken a Carbon Assessment of its supply chain to help establish a baseline across Scope 3 emissions. With regards to Emissions Scope 1 and 2 the company evaluated office and travel emissions, which were comparatively lower than that of Scope 3 emissions. Carbon Report available for reference below. Energy use is monitored and the company moved into a new building which operates on 100% renewable energy, selected specifically for its sustainability credentials.
	 The company has the following carbon emissions targets: Become carbon neutral for Scope 1 and 2 emissions by end 2025 - investigating potential of insetting through supply chain. Review scope 3 emission baselines and set science based targets by end 2023. Conduct soil carbon pilot projects on 6-12 properties by end 2023.
	Company's Energy specific targets include: • Maintain 100% renewable energy used in Paradigm Foods office. • Work with building manager to find ways to further reduce energy intensity and set measurable targets
	With regards to Scope 3 Emissions management the company's ROOTS program aims to help farmers to understand their carbon baseline as well as promote regenerative principles, including soil carbon sequestration through soil management and utilizing livestock to transfer nutrients.
