Disclosure Questionnaire Category: Business in Conflict Zones

Topic	Company has suppliers located in Conflict Zones.
Summary of Issue	The company imports diverse goods from conflict zones, and sells them through its website and retailers. They sources products from conflict zones such as Afghanistan, Yemen, DR Congo, Burkina Faso, Myanmar and Niger. The conflicts in these regions are characterized by social, political, and economic unrest, making them challenging environments with disrupted economies. The company sources in those locations to create economic opportunities and income in conflict-affected countries. By
	sourcing from these areas, warfair aims to contribute to job creation and economic stability in regions facing challenges due to conflicts.
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	Percentage of Purchases from Each Conflict Zone (Last Fiscal Year 22): - Yemen: 48% - Afghanistan: 34.7% - DR Congo: 6.1% - Burkina Faso: 7.8% - Myanmar: 0.3% - Niger: 3.1%
Impact on Stakeholders	Business activities located in conflict zones can contribute to jobs, income and stability but are considered high-risk as they can also cause or contribute to the conflict and/or sociopolitical instability. Countries classified as conflict zones are more likely to have a weak rule-of-law or a corrupt judicial system, which could undermine the effectiveness of operational grievance mechanisms for these businesses and their suppliers. In addition, the safety of the company's workers and other potential human rights violations can be at risk. warfair carries out due-diligence for each partner and product and publishes the results transparently on www.warfair.world to mitigate these risks.
Implemented Management Practices	The imports from DR Congo are certified by Rainforest Alliance, and those from Burkina Faso are certified Fair Trade (FLOCERT). However, there are no certifications available for products from Afghanistan or Yemen, Myanmar and Niger.



	The company reported for due diligence for all companies, utilizing questionnaires, references, internet searches (including in local languages), visits, or video inspections where possible, where each company undergoes approval by our Ethics Committee, and a comprehensive public record of all information is maintained on their warfair database at: see (Report) section. The due diligence process includes inquiries and follow-ups on aspects such as "do-no-harm" principles, links to conflict actors, anti-corruption measures, and social/environmental/workplace considerations.
