Issue Date	2013-2025
Topic	Litigation related to consumer protection and employment law issues
Summary of Issue	In the last 5 years, the company has had material cases related to consumer protection and employment law issues.
	The consumer protection case is a class action related to a prepaid credit card issued/bought between November 1, 2008 and July 18, 2016 and used for consumer purchases. The allegations are related to the activation fee and other fees charged with respect to prepaid cards issued by the bank were contrary to provincial consumer protection legislation. The case is still pending resolution.
	The company also has 2 cases related to the amount of severance payable to former employees (in excess of minimum amounts strictly payable under applicable employment law statutes). One case is still pending resolution.
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	The financial value associated with employment law cases represents less than 2% of the revenue.
Impact on Stakeholder(s)	Violation of consumer protection and employment law regulations can generate financial and well-being losses to the affected parties.
Resolution	The class action and one employment law case are still pending resolution. One employment law case was settled with payment (<2% of the revenue).
Implemented Management Practices	The company has decided to discontinue prepaid cards since 2021.
	With respect to the labor disputes, VCIB claims to have reasonable practices in place with respect to terminations to treat employees fairly. Disputes over severance amounts that may be payable under common law principles are not



	uncommon where employment relationships end for any business. Where disputes arise about severance amounts, VCIB is committed to reaching fair and appropriate resolutions.
