Issue Date	(1) The Late 2014 - Early 2015 Incident and (2) The Late 2016 - Early 2017 Incident
Topic	Regulatory inquiries and class action lawsuit resulting from potential data breaches
Summary of Issue	The Late 2014 - Early 2015 Incident: In 2018, Bombas discovered that malware, which provided access to certain consumer information, was present in the code of its third party e-commerce platform (which was developed and managed by an outside vendor) from January 15, 2015 until it was removed on February 9, 2015. The data accessed may have included personal information such as names, addresses, and credit card information. This incident was disclosed to potentially impacted consumers and government authorities in 2018. Certain state Attorneys General instituted claims against Bombas alleging that Bombas did not notify individuals or state officials in a timely manner.
	The Late 2016 - Early 2017 Incident: Separately in 2019, as part of a review of data security, Bombas discovered that malicious code designed to scrape credit card numbers and other personal information may have been present on its site, which is powered by Shopify, as early as November 11, 2016. Bombas launched an investigation to determine whether personal information of our customers was potentially exposed, and on May 20, 2020, Bombas received an investigative report, which could not rule out the possibility that the malicious code could have successfully scraped customer information. The report also confirmed that a new security feature, which was added to the e-commerce platform on February 16, 2017, prevented the malicious code from functioning after that date. The data accessed may have included personal information such as names, addresses, and credit card information. This incident was disclosed to potentially impacted consumers and government authorities in June 2020. In 2020, a class action lawsuit stemming from the 2016 data
	security incident was filed in the Northern District of California.
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, #	Approximately 122,000 total customers in the aggregate may have been impacted by the data security incidents.



of individuals affected)	Civil penalties have been assessed by some state regulators, and a settlement has been reached in the class action lawsuit. In sum, the aggregate amount of civil penalties and settlement funds related to both data security incidents accounted for less than 0.2% of the company's annual net revenue for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2021.
Impact on Stakeholders	Potentially affected customers may have had personal and credit card data exposed. Limited reports of misuse (fewer than 50) were recorded during the time of the incidents. No further misuse related to these incidents has been reported.
Implemented Management Practices	Following the data security incidents, Bombas has implemented various policies regarding privacy and data security, implemented all regulatory recommendations and continues to implement and work towards best practices related to privacy and data security.
Resolution	Bombas has settled and/or responded to all regulatory inquiries in connection with both data security incidents. Bombas has also entered into a settlement in connection with the class action lawsuit filed in the Northern District of California.
