Disclosure Questionnaire Category: Other - Clients in Controversial Industries

Topic	Clients in Controversial Industries
Summary of Issue	Value Books is a company based in Japan that is involved in the purchase and sale of used books and magazines and was also involved in the sale of products to educational institutions called "Juvenile Training Schools". These institutions are judicial under the jurisdiction of the Ministry of Justice (MOJ, i.e. Japanese Government) that provide corrective education and reintegration support for the purpose of fostering the sound cultivation of juveniles sent as a protective measure by family courts.
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	Indirect sales to the Prison Industry represented 0.003% of the company's FY2022 revenue.
Impact on Stakeholders	Companies that work with clients in controversial industries can indirectly increase the harmful impact to stakeholders by enabling business growth. Therefore, companies that work with clients in these industries should have practices in place to ensure that their impact is aimed at decreasing the negative impacts of the industry.
	B Lab has flagged the involvement of companies with clients in controversial industries as a material issue and new standards will be created to address possible risks related to this matter.
Implemented Management Practices	As the company's involvement with the Prison industry is through the Juvenile Training schools under the jurisdiction of the Ministry of Justice, the company does not have a public stance on mass incarceration (which is not happening in Japan) yet has a publicly stated mission to "Build the environment where anyone in Japan and in the world have the freedom to read books, to learn from books and enjoy reading books."
	Value Books co-organized a study tour with a) a non-profit organization "Sodateagenet" who have been supporting underserved youth for a long time and b) a juvenile training school (Ministry of Justice) to visit a juvenile training school after which an employee of Value Books published an article on the company's website reflecting on his interactions and experience; raising awareness of the detention centers and the juveniles that

Disclosure Questionnaire Category: Pornography products

Topic	Sale of pornography products
Summary of Issue	Value Books is a company based in Japan that is involved in the purchase and sale of used books and magazines and has been involved in the purchase and sale of pornography products such as magazines and DVDs over the last 5 years. Value Books has formally committed to no longer have pornography products as part of their business.
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	Revenue from pornography products represented 0.4% of the company's FY2022 total revenue.
Impact on Stakeholders	The growth of the pornography industry has a number of controversies attached to it, the increasingly violent industry presents ethical and moral issues as well as poses a challenge to public health, normalizing violent behavior and relationships and contributing to notions of inequality for women. In addition, the pornography industry has had proven associations to human rights violations, child pornography and sex trafficking. Companies currently involved with the pornography are not currently permitted to pursue B Corp Certification, as standards have not yet been developed to manage the risks from this industry.
Implemented Management Practices	Value Books had controls in place to only acquire approved pornography products that complied with both Japanese Law and self-regulation. The company also had implemented measures to restrict access to areas where these products were stored in their warehouse. The company was not involved in buying or selling illegal or unapproved products. In addition to not selling illegal pornographic products, in 2023, the company has decided to discontinue the sale of pornography products in general, and it will no longer form part of their business.
