

How Brave Buttons Work

- 1. Install Brave Buttons in each unit and common area.
- 2. Residents press a button once to request a non-emergency check-in, or more than once to indicate an emergency.
- 3. The Responder Phone receives a text message with details on where help is needed and how urgently.
- 4. Your designated responder checks that location.
- 5. After they check in with the resident, they can log details about what happened.
