Disclosure Questionnaire Category: Operations in Russia

Issue Date	February 24th, 2022
Topic	Company previously had operations in Russia
Summary of Issue	Bugaboo International BV previously had operations in Russia which were placed on hold on February 24, 2022. In addition to having a legal entity present, the company had 4 employees based out of Russia. B Lab is currently developing standards for companies operating and/or exiting operations in high risk contexts (including Russia) and this company will be required to meet those standards during their next recertification cycle.
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	Bugaboo International BV had a total of 4 employees working in Russia at the time of the invasion. In an effort to freeze all business practices in Russia, the company placed the contracts of the employees on hold while continuing payment through June 2022. Of the 4 employees that remained in Russia, 2 of the contracts were terminated with a settlement agreed upon both parties in June 2022. The remaining two employees were transferred to other regions of the company's business. One employee is now working for South Region, supporting sales for Israel and Middle East region, working remotely from Russia. Another employee is now working as Marketing Specialist for Eastern Europe, mainly focused on Czech republic and Slovakia, also working remotely from Russia. In addition to aforementioned steps taken by the company, Bugaboo International BV also initiated the process of closing their legal entity registered in Russia. However, with the invasion remaining active, the company has not been able to fully close the legal entity citing blockers by the local authorities as the reason.
Impact on Stakeholders	High-risk contexts are characterized by institutional weakness, political instability, insecurity, armed conflict, widespread violence, or other risks of harm to people. Business can cause, contribute to, or be directly linked to a myriad of human rights abuses and environmental harms. Because respect for human rights is the internationally recognized minimum or "floor" for



	responsible business conduct, a business cannot be a force for good if it causes, contributes or is directly linked to human rights violations.
Resolution	As a result of Russia's invasion of Ukraine, the company placed all business activities on hold effective February 23, 2022 and there has been no active business or revenue coming from Russia since then. Once available, new standards related to responsible exit and/or remediation may be required for the company during their next recertification cycle.

Disclosure Questionnaire Category: Recalls

Issue Date	2019 and 2022
Topic	Recall due to potential suffocation hazard
Summary of Issue	Bugaboo has had two recalls in the last five years: <u>Case 1:</u> potential suffocation hazard. Potential suffocation hazard for an infant if product were assembled incorrectly. Product reached customers, but no injuries, illnesses or issues were reported. <u>Case 2:</u> chemical hazard. Product contained a small label where lead had been used within the ink, resulting in a non-compliant level of lead. Toxicology report indicated exposure to be lower than the expected natural environmental exposure and subsequently a low risk.
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	The products affected by these recalls represent <1% of the company's products during the reporting period from 2018 to 2023.
Impact on Stakeholders	Exposure to lead can have negative impact on a child's health and cause, among others, damage to the brain and nervous system, slowed growth and development, or learning and behavior problems. As reported by Health Canada in their recall case, if an unattended infant is placed crosswise on the bassinet inlay without the accompanying mattress support board, an uneven sleeping surface may be created posing a potential risk of injury or death due to suffocation. Stakeholders affected: Case 1: No illnesses/injuries reported.
Implemented Management Practices	Case 1: Issue identified by Health Canada: Factory fitted support board in cradle could be removed for washing and user could attempt to use the product without refitment. Product subsequently modified to prevent removal of support board; product modification adopted globally. Case 2: Issue identified by Bugaboo during routine testing and reported to authorities. Full investigation conducted into



	contamination/change of ink material at supplier and action taken to prevent reoccurrence. Routine and final release testing enhanced to monitor supplier.
