Issue Date	Ongoing
Topic	Leather Manufacturing
Summary of Issue	R.M.Williams' product supply chains comprise of the procurement of materials (such as leather) and components for manufacturing in the R.M.Williams workshop in South Australia, and procurement of finished goods from both domestic Australian and international supply chain partners. In the former supply chain there are water intensive stages, particularly the leather tanning stage.
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	R.M.Williams leather is sourced from 26 tanneries across Australia, New Zealand, Bangladesh, France, Germany, India, Italy, Mexico, Portugal, Spain, South Africa, and the USA. Approximately two-thirds of the company's tanneries are in High or Extremely high water stress regions.
Impact on Stakeholders	Tanning is a water intensive process using between 170-550 Litres/hide. This water is discharged to the environment, for which standards of treatment vary by jurisdiction and facility.
Implemented Management Practices	The company has implemented a goal to source 100% of its leather from Leather Working Group (LWG) Gold rated tanneries. The LWG certification is an independent 3rd party audit that assesses the environmental performance and compliance of tanneries. This standard is used to assess leather manufacturers on water & energy use, solid waste & effluent management, air & noise emissions, traceability, health & safety, chemical management, restricted substances, compliance & chromium VI (CrVI) Management). The company also accepts accreditation from the Sustainable Leather Foundation (SLF), a separate program not affiliated with LWG. The company currently sources approximately 90% of its leather from tanneries that have been audited by the LWG. Of the
	company's 26 supplier tanneries, 11 tanneries are LWG Gold rated and 4 tanneries are LWG Silver rated. One tannery is accredited to the Sustainable Leather Foundation.
	Of the tanneries in High or Extremely High water stressed regions, all are in the LWG or SLF auditing programs.
