Sensitive issues identified through background checks may or may not be within the scope of questions in the Disclosure Questionnaire, but undergo the same review process and are subject to the same possible review by the Standards Advisory Council, including ineligibility for B Corp Certification, required remediation, or disclosure.

Any party may submit a complaint about a current B Corp through B Lab's Public Complaint Process. Grounds for complaint include:

- Intentional misrepresentation of practices, policies, and/or claimed outcomes during the company's certification process
- 2) Breaches of the B Corp Community's core values as expressed in our Declaration of Interdependence

Disclosure Questionnaire Category: Animal Testing

Topic	The company voluntarily tests on animals
Summary of Issue	PiLeJe, headquartered in Paris, France, manufactures and sells food supplements and herbal medicine products. There is no regulatory obligation to implement animal testing for these types of products, but the company opts to do so for safety and medical-scientific purposes in order to select effective ingredients and understand their mode of action.
Size/Scope of Issue (e.g. \$ financial implication, # of individuals affected)	In 2023, 1% of the company's portfolio products underwent animal testing.
Impact on Stakeholders	Animal testing and experimentation is widely used to develop and test the safety of new healthcare and/or food products. Many of these experiments can cause pain to the animals involved or reduce their quality of life in other ways.
Implemented Management Practices	PiLeJe subcontracts specialized external laboratories subject to authorization in accordance with the EU regulations (Directive 2010/63/EU). These laboratories can proceed with animal testing in accordance with the protocols approved by the Ethics Committees that are responsible for assessing the acceptability of the protocols, the relevance of the study, and the damage caused to animal welfare. Laboratories must consider the Replacement, Reduction, and Refinement strategies (3R rule). The company is committed to ethical research and responsible innovation and prioritizes alternative methods whenever possible by implementing non-animal testing approaches, such as in vitro and in tubo, to reduce reliance on animal testing. PiLeJe has created an internal Animal Welfare Policy with the commitments implemented within the company in order to minimize the use of animal testing and reduce animal suffering. Commitment to use animal testing only in the following cases: • A regulatory requirement for the marketing of a product; • Research work carried out on ingredients, plant extracts, or strains of bacteria, which enter or could enter into the composition of its food supplements or medical devices.



In addition, PiLeJe commits to:

- Work only with specialized laboratories, public or private, located in Europe or North America, and respect the French regulations;
- Do not work on animals other than rodents;
- Not using animal testing in the development of cosmetics;
- Apply the "5Rs" principles, built upon the original "3Rs" (Replacement, Reduction, and Refinement), emphasizing ethical and responsible animal research by also including "Rigour" and "Reproducibility.
- Actively support research aimed at developing alternative models such as simple organism models (C. elegans, Nematodes) or human organoids.
- Only carry out animal studies after authorization by the internal Ethics Committee.

All the documentation relating to the animal testing as the contract with the external laboratory, the experimental protocol, the deliberations of the internal ethics committee, as well as the authorization by the Ministry of Research, must be documented and archived by Pileje.



Disclosure Questionnaire Category: Energy and Emissions Intensive Industry
