BUILDING TIPS

If you are building an ARF or a kit and you would like to secure your antenna inside the fuselage, you can use rubber cement. Just put a few dabs of rubber cement along the inside of the fuselage so the antenna wire can be pressed into it. This will hold the antenna securely and can be moved around without any sanding by just peeling the rubber cement off.


