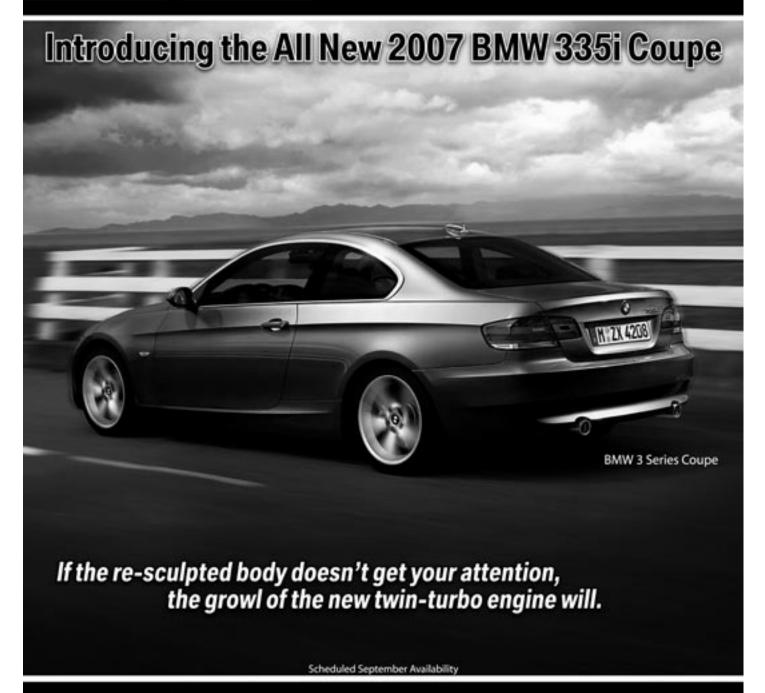

The Club will have an information booth all weekend and I'm looking for volunteers to spend one or two hours at our booth. Volunteers will receive free admission

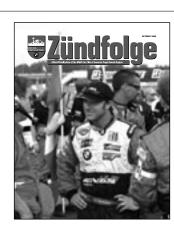

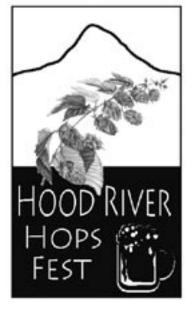

Videos will start around 7 p.m. and run about two hours. Bison Creek Pizza will have their *All You Can Eat Pizza*

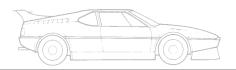

Car Control Skills Day, November 5

The Puget sound region provides a comprehensive driver training program designed to help our members enjoy the performance potential of their BMWs in a safe, controlled and structured environment. The first step in participation is our car control skills training day, held at Bremerton Raceway Park twice a year, once in the spring and once in the fall.

First we start with an evening ground school, typically the Thursday beforehand, to introduce you to the ideas we'll be teaching you at Bremerton on Saturday. The skills training day at Bremerton will be comprised of training stations where you will be driving with an instructor in your passenger seat. Each station will offer a chance to see what your car does when pushed beyond the normal envelope. The speeds are kept purposely low so that upsets and spins won't result in damage to your car.

If you're an experienced driver who'd like to work on your car control skills, I encourage you to sign up. I'm going to reserve a group just for experienced drivers to run a somewhat different set of drills planned by Chris Mason. We're also going to set up a pair of autocrosses at the end of day everyone can participate in, so you'll get lots of seat time.

Requirements

- You must be a Club member. We also honor PCA, BMW ACA, and BMW CCBC memberships.
- You must be 18 years old with a valid driver's license.

- Tech inspections are required and must be dated within thirty days of the event. A link to the tech inspection form will be included with your confirmation packet. The form can also be downloaded from the Club web site. A certified technician must perform these inspections. You may use your usual shop or see the Club bulletin board for a list of shops who agreed to perform tech inspection at a special CCA price.
- Helmets are required. A Snell 2000 or newer rated helmet must be used. If a helmet is Snell rated it will have a tag inside the liner indicating the Snell year. If you have a question about this, ask your equipment provider.
- *Convertibles* are allowed only if they have fixed rollover protection and 5-point harnesses.

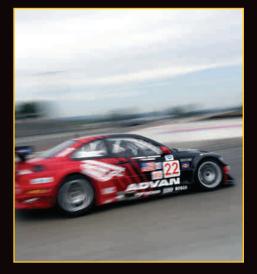

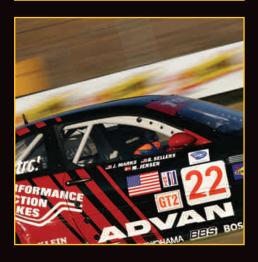

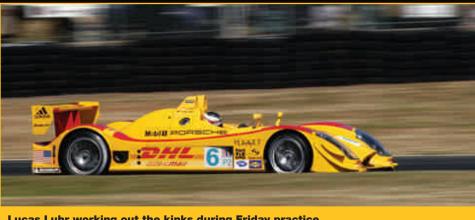

Your Car is Ready . . .

The four best words you can hear from your dealer are "Your car is ready." I have had my share of BMWs in the shop for varied reasons. Most of the time I can't wait to get them back so I can drive them. There have been occasions when I don't need them right away because of vacations or other activities but for the most part I want them back as soon as possible.

They say you need to meet your dealer's service manager; I not only have met him, he and all his cohorts know me by my first name. They know what kind of oil I prefer, what I do for a living, I think they may even have a lien on my first born. They know all my cars and are a great source of information.

I hear horror stories all the time about dealers and how someone got shafted. In my experience this is due to miscommunication and misunderstandings. Now you have to be thinking that I must work for a car dealership. I don't. I am an IT guy by trade and a car freak by nature.

Getting a big car bill can be like having a nice meal at an upscale restaurant: you order a few drinks and have an appetizer or two, then the bill comes and you are shocked at the price of dinner. Maybe they should make you pay before you eat, while you are still hungry, so you can justify the cost of the meal and its accoutrements.

The best way to make sure you and your dealer are on the same page is to be sure you and the service manager are at a complete understanding of the work and the outcome of the work that needs to be done on your BMW. Have a good understanding of the parts being replaced and all costs that are included.

Most people just drop their car off and discuss what its symptoms are and leave it at that. Don't be afraid to ask to talk with a technician concerning your issue: generally they have a pretty good idea of what it could be. Now be careful here, remember the technician is just making a guess at this point which gives you a general idea of the issue. When he gets into it could be something completely different.

Generally speaking the technician is correct, although once knee deep into the problem other issues may arise that either caused the problem or will defer it from happening again. This of course can cost more money. Make sure your service manager is aware any additional work beyond what has been discussed has to be made clear by a phone call before continuing to throw parts or labor at the problem.

Now, having said all this, there can still be issues that arise. For example my wife has a Ford F-150. (I have been married for twenty-one years and have stopped trying to make sense of what she wants; instead I just make sure she gets it.)

The dealer we bought her truck from has been derelict in ordering parts for months at a time, has been impossible to get answers from, and over all a real disappointment. Fortunately I found another Ford dealer in a township very close, and have been nothing but

pleased with their service and care of the vehicle.

Unfortunately some of us don't have multiple BMW dealers to choose from. I have found if a problem that arises and does not get solved to my satisfaction, writing a letter to the owner of the dealership can work wonders.

The reason this is heavy on my mind is because I just got my 535is out of the shop. They cut some rust from a spot near the shock tower and repaired it beautifully; also they replaced a broken differential mount. I had just been enjoying it for a few days; I came out of the barber shop and BAM! It will not start. I spent almost two hours under the hood to no avail. So I had it towed to the dealer, where everybody who works there says "here comes Dave's 5er."

So here I am waiting on this beautiful morning for the phone to ring and hear those four wonderful words "Your car is ready."

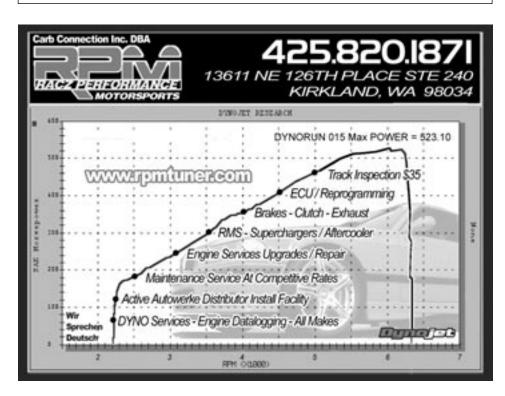

Some things just don't LAST. We have many wear items on our BMWs and other parts we expect to last a very long time. As I've mentioned earlier in my writings about returning the 2002ti to full road service, I worried about the original differential that has over 433,000 miles on it. It has too much play and some noise so I'm replacing it. As the 2002 is a very early 1969 it has a long neck differential, rather than the much more common short neck style which was phased into production in mid '69. Many years ago, I added a limited slip carrier to aid in the art of autocross. It was set up as best as we could and did last for over twenty years. In order to change to the later style differential, I need to change the entire subframe, reusing the trailing arms and brakes. I am going to a E21 320is 3.91 limited slip. I had to get one from California as they are becoming rarer here. The 320 differential is about a half inch narrower than a 2002 differential. The case is the same, the output flanges are narrower. There are several ways to make

this up. Spacers are available that make up the difference. Special half shafts made up of a mix of 320 and 2002 CV joints are needed with the spacers as the 320 differential uses larger bolts. The 1975/76 2002 differential's output flanges fit the 320 differential and make up the half inch difference and allow the normal 2002 half shafts. The output flanges need a groove machined into them for the circlip retainers of the 320i differential. I have a 1975 differential to salvage them from, along with the finned back cover that adds some additional amount of fluid capacity. I have to get a different shortened 2002 driveshaft for the five speed conversion as the long neck will not work. I elected to get a rebuilt from Ireland Engineering as they were the best deal.

I removed the whole subframe as a unit. On the 2002 it is a matter of undoing

the parking brake lines, the brake lines, the shocks and disconnecting the driveshaft. Four nuts later the unit comes down. This way I can swap out the necessary items off of the car. I'm replacing the trailing arm bushings with urethane to match the front and that will complete a total bushing rebuild on the car. I plan to reinstall the subframe as an assembly in order to spend less time on my back.

The 2002ti sits on some new 15X7 Kosei K1 racing wheels with 205/50/15 Bridgestones SO3's that were a great closeout deal I couldn't pass up. The wheels have a 27mm offset and fit nicely under the fenders without flares. I needed to gently massage the front fender lips slightly but they clear under loaded turns. The wheels and tires sure fill out the wheel wells nicely! The grip is incredible and they look really great too. I originally thought the

wheels would require the turbo flares but that isn't the case, so I bartered the flares for a short neck subframe and core driveshaft. I got a great deal on the flares so the barter worked out well. The tires are slightly taller than the 205/60/13's that came off and the 3.91 gearing is 5% taller than the 4.10 I used for 34 years, so at some point I will need to have the speedometer recalibrated for these changes. I will lose a little acceleration but I will gain a lot of low end grip that would otherwise go up in wheel spin.

I rebuilt the front calipers as they were a bit sticky from the lack of use over the last two years. I made sure to paint them real nice to show off the big brakes behind the new wheels. I'm quickly running out of delayed maintenance items on the car and I'm looking forward to getting the last of the body work done. I found some fabric paint to change the blue Recaro's to black and have plans for completing the back seat removal. I have found working on the 2002 to be more enjoyable when I don't have to worry about finishing it up to drive to work.

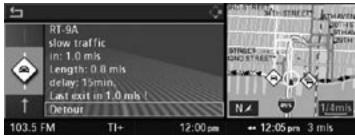

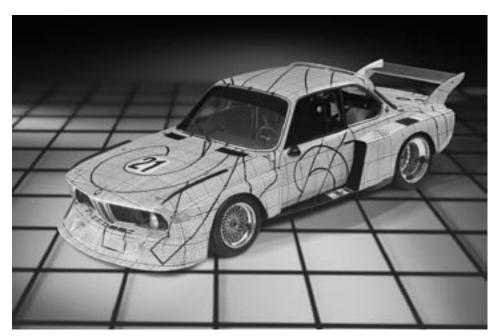
THE BMW ART CAR WORLD TOUR KICKS OFF IN KUALA LUMPUR

In a parallel tour the BMW Art Cars of Alexander Calder (1975), Matazo Kayama (1990), David Hockney (1995), and Jenny Holzer (1999) will be exhibited throughout Taiwan, China, Russia and Africa. Stops are the National Taiwan Museum of Fine Arts in Taichung, the Museum of Contemporary Art in Shanghai, the Long March Space in

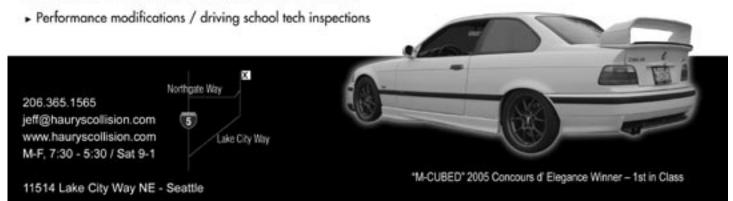
