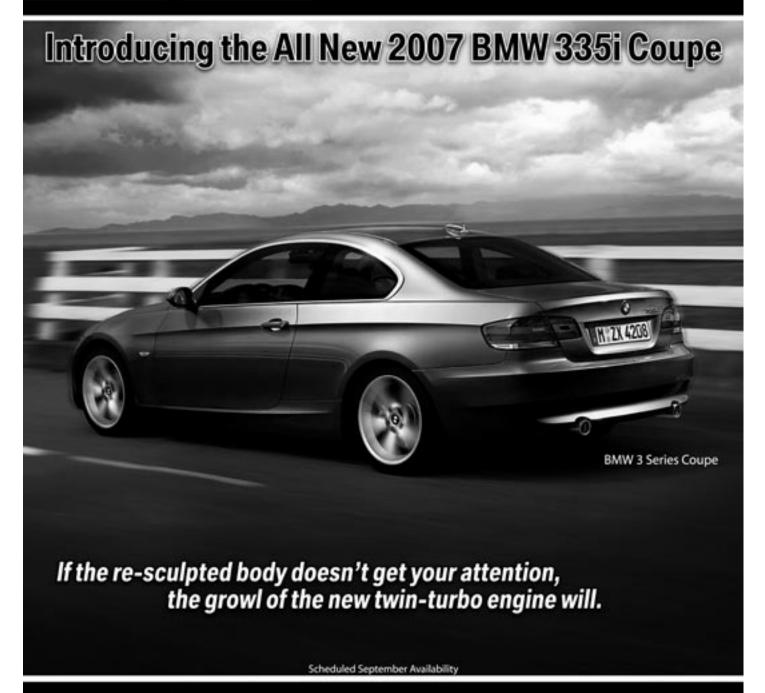


The tour requires some walking and climbing of stairs, so be sure to wear comfortable shoes. Wheelchair access is

After the tour you can check out some of the other attractions of Newhalem including Ladder Creek Falls and Rock Gardens, Old Number Six locomotive, Trail of the Cedars and the Skagit General Store.



#### Ralph in the Afternoon

EVERY TIME I go to the track, in fact, every time I go out on track, I hope to learn something new. Some skill, some technical aspect, some speed secret I didn't know before I went out. Sometimes, as the saying goes, be careful what you ask for.

We encourage our instructors to offer rides in their cars as charity auction items. It's good PR for the BMW CCA, it brings people into our world of high performance driving (and maybe they will come back and take a school), and finally it raises money for good causes. Last year I had the pleasure of giving a ride in my car to an auction for a local school. Some weeks later I received a call from the auction winner, a school mom that had bought the ride for her teenage son. She described her son as a "speed freak" who "raced motorcycles and loved everything that goes fast."

Sometimes, as the saying goes, be careful what you ask for.

Over the course of the next few weeks, I talked to her and her husband about the arrangements for getting their son into my car. I also gave them a good idea of what to expect when they came out to the track and that because "Ralph" (not his real name) was a young driver, I would emphasize safety, awareness and that the track is the place to go fast, not the streets and highways.

On the big day, Ralph and his dad were to show up after lunch when things aren't so hectic at the track. When they arrived and I got a chance to talk to them, I was vaguely aware that most of the conversation was with dad and Ralph, while interested, was very quiet. In fact, he only spoke when I asked him specific questions that required more than a yes or no. They were ready to go!

We got down to the business of getting Ralph fitted for a helmet and strapped into the car. I talked about the car, and what to expect as we moved through pre-grid and finally out onto the track. As I always do for new riders, I described as much about the track and what I was going to be doing as I could. I took the first few laps at a slow, but increasing pace so he could get used to the new sensations. As I talked to him, he always responded with muted enthusiasm about his aspirations for getting into racing cars and his present hobby of racing bikes. As we pulled off the track, although quiet as was his nature, he seemed really excited about the ride and



he looked forward to talking to his dad and going out for a second ride.

When the second ride came an hour later, we repeated the preparation of his first time out and entered the track with him smiling from ear to ear. I picked up the pace a little from the first session and continued to describe what I was doing, thinking about, looking at, and why. I also spent a lot of time talking about the responsibilities of driving. Now, normally I can assess how comfortable my passenger is by changes in their speech patterns—specifically, if they become quiet it's usually a sign that they have stopped enjoying their ride for one reason or another. Unfortunately Ralph was a quiet young man and so my first indication that he was becoming uncomfortable was exiting Turn 2 when he asked if we could take the next few corners "a little easy." "No problem," I said as I peddled around the back side of the track and waved cars to pass me as we worked our way around the twisty bits. My brain was still locked on "speed freak, racer, etc." and I hadn't quite shifted gears yet to the fact that most of this came from mom and dad, while Ralph was much more reserved. Just before we got to the track exit, Ralph quickly asked if we could pull off and just as I did, I heard that horrible sound through the communicator that no one wants to hear, that sound of death in

the afternoon, that sound that forecasts hours spent shampooing carpets, swabbing leather and digging into every nook and cranny of the right seat. Oh, the humanity!


In the aftermath after Ralph got his legs back, I apologized again for making him sick, and he apologized to me for messing up my car. And then dad gave me the key bit of information they should have told me before we started. He said, "Don't worry about Ralph, he does this every time we go fishing!"

So what did I learn about Ralph in the afternoon?

- 1. Ask your rider if they have any problems with motion sickness
- 2. Don't set your expectations based on anything the parents say
- 3. Don't assume anything
- 4. Carry an air sickness bag
- 5. Even a 7/10s pace can be a handful for some people
- 6. Most importantly, don't let your rider go out for a Mexican lunch before you take them on track!

BMW Seattle also provided a BMW Cruise Bicycle that was raffled off at the end of the day to one of our lucky members. Griot's Garage was also on hand again, doling out great car care maintenance kits to those in attendance. Everyone has no excuse to not keep their BMWs leather soft and supple now. Mark Greene of Griot's Garage picked Denny Organ's 1972 Bavaria as the winner of the yearly Preservation Award.

Great to see many of the SIGs coming out as groups! The only thing better than seeing one E31 is seeing eight in a row! Same with the 3s, 5s and 7s out

on the lawn. The featured BMW this year was the Z3 Coupe. I lost count, but was told by Coupe Group leader Doug Mill that an amazing forty-six of these beautiful machines made it out! This was indeed a record for Featured Car turnout. The People's Choice award went to a very special Coupe, an S54 powered Coupe brought by Mike Helton. Mike's car which races nationally

in the Grand Am Cup is believed to be the only race-prepped S54-powered Coupe in the country.

Thank you to all the volunteers who put in many hours making the event so fun. The work of the judges was particularly hard this year with the heat and the record turnout of judged BMWs. We'll be looking for a few more volunteer judges to help next year.

#### Rob Wagner 1988 M3

When my wife and I arrived at the BMW Concours, we were extremely excited to get set up and to start mingling with the BMW crowd. I am an E30 M3 owner who looks forward to every gathering our Club can think up. At the concours, there was a freshly cut green lawn that was prepped for us BMW Club enthusiasts to park. As I pulled my car into its resting spot for the day, I was directed to get the car just perfect by the lead of a volunteer of the Club. I shut off the motor and began to unload the cooler, along with chairs and suntan lotion that was all in the trunk. A man that I parked next to was Don, a friend of the Club for many years and an E30 M3 owner as well, who needed a hand getting his canopy set up and ready for the day. After I had talked to a few

members, another E30 M3 parked next to mine on the other side of me. Marty, who had worked hard on his silver beauty, offered to let my wife and I use his canopy for shelter during the event. Marty had a story about his car and pictures to go along with it ... about how he found his M3 and the condition it was in and how he was going to make it beautiful again. We passed him on the way home on the freeway, and I gave him a honk and a wave, and he gave me a thumbs-up. Thanks to Lance and the many volunteers for making a totally awesome BMW event.

#### Doug Barritt 2000 M Coupe

This being The Year of the Coupe (the Z3 Coupe being the featured marque), it was a foregone conclusion that I would be participating in the Concours, which I had never done before, except to display my BMW motorcycle. My primary goal was to help urge the Northwest Coupe Groupe to make a good showing, and that we did, with 46 of our fifty-nine members showing up (apparently setting a record for a featured marque).

I've always kept my cars pretty clean and had mastered the techniques of making a previous black car look really good (thanks to Jim Millet), but I've never been quite anal enough to go all the way to true concours-level preparation. In fact, I've been under a standing threat of divorce if I ever became one of those "Q-Tip Guys!" So I just signed up for "Display Class" only.

But as the Concours approached, I kept half-heartedly working away on the car a little here and a little there, especially under the hood, telling myself that if I could make the engine bay presentable, maybe I would upgrade to "Judged" class. Finally, on the Tuesday before the Concours, the engine bay suddenly looked pretty damn good (by my standards!), so I went ahead and removed and fully cleaned up the wheels, scrubbed out the wheel wells (a real messy job, however, a totally wasted effort since I found out later that wheel wells weren't judged (but I did see a lot of tidy wheel wells at the Concours). By this time, I "hurt so bad" and had "significant hours" invested in the project, that I emailed Lance that I would upgrade to Judged class at the Concours (for just \$10 more). I was really committed now!

The rest of the prep work (deep clean the interior, wash, mask, glaze and wax the exterior) was pretty straightforward, enhanced significantly by important tips from perpetual-winner and friend, Keith Fournier. But (don't tell Meg), there WERE places where I was forced to use those dreaded Q-Tips, a toothbrush, and even a few toothpicks (shhhhhhh) to remove all visible dirt, stain and residual wax from the nook and crannies. The kicker was that I was down to my last two days, and the weather had gotten really hot, running about 92-95 degrees in my garage most of the day and evening. Ughh! That last day of waxing and final primping was a killer!

Feeling really good about my final results, I showed up on Sunday at the Concours reasonably confident of a "podium finish," even though it was my

first time. (Aren't all true competitors confident? Otherwise, why would they do it? I could be Rookie of the Year!) Well, when I got a chance to see my competition lining up at the Park, two lengthy rows of immaculate Coupes, I suddenly realized that nearly ALL of them looked GREAT (Oh, my god!). I did a furious last-minute primping of the car all-around, and sat down with the car in the broiling heat to await the judges. It was during the judging that I learned that "all visible surfaces clean" isn't good enough; the criteria REALLY is, "all accessible surfaces clean," where "accessible" means "can you reach it with your little finger?" And, heaven forbid, I left some towel lint on my hood liner!

So, no, I didn't win any trophies, but I did enjoy making my car look the best it ever has, I learned what it's really gonna take, and I certainly enjoyed the camaraderie of my fellow competitors! 

#### Jon Maddux 2001 M Coupe





The elected positions include: President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, Membership Coordinator, Roster Manager, Concours Coordinator, Banquet Coordinator, Tech Event Coordinator and Tour Coordinator. To be eligible for President you must have been on the Board for the immediately preceding two years. To be Vice-President, Secretary or Treasurer, you must have been on the Board for the immediately preceding year. The other positions are open to those who have been Club members in good standing for at least one year.



If you would like to be involved in the administration of the Club, we always welcome volunteers. But this isn't simply a matter of coming to a Board meeting once a month and voicing your opinion. The Club has no paid staff. That means everything that happens in this Club happens through the efforts of volunteers. In other words, Board positions mean a commitment to work! That's not to say that involvement in Club administration isn't fun, it is, Most Board members find their work on the Board and with the other Board members to be enjoyable and rewarding.

Here are the duties of the various elected Board positions:

President—Responsible for the overall operation of the Club. Leads Board meetings and makes sure all the other Board members are doing their jobs.

Vice President—Fills in when the President is unavailable. Also responsible for social events not assigned to other Board members.

**Secretary**—Records the minutes of Board meetings.

Membership Coordinator—Handles mailings to new members and the recruitment of new members. Also picks up the mail at the Club post office box.

Roster Manager—Manages the Club's membership database in coordination with the National office. Provides the mailing list for Zündfolge and other mailings.

**Concours Coordinator**—Responsible for all aspects of the Club's annual Concours d'Elegance in July.

**Banquet Coordinator**—Responsible for the Club's annual banquet and auction in January.

Tech Event Coordinator—Organizes or facilitates Club technical events. These are usually hosted by a business.

**Tour Coordinator**—Organizes or facilitates Club driving tours.

SIG Coordinator—The Board liaison with the various Special Interest Groups.

There are also appointed (rather than elected) Board positions. These include:

**Zündfolge**—Responsible for creation and distribution of the Zündfolge plus advertising in the magazine. The Zündfolge has two staff members who are on the Board.

Track—Manages all aspects of the Club's high-speed track driving program. Track also has two committee members on the Board.

Web Site Coordinator—Handles everything on the Club's web site.

**Risk Management**—Responsible for insurance, risk management and legal issues.

Besides Board positions, there are other ways to get involved. One is to attend Board meetings as a general member. Another way is to get involved with one of the committees that the Club has. These include the Track Driving Events Committee, the Zündfolge staff, the Banquet Committee and the Concours d'Elegance Committee. There is also the opportunity to chair an event such as a general meeting, tour, rally, video night or tech session. Getting involved in one of these committees or chairing an event is probably the best way to find out whether you might enjoy a Board position in the future.

For those that would like to run for one of the elected Board positions for 2007, please contact one or all of the committee members (contact information below) or send your expression of interest to the Club post office box. We can tell you more about the duties of each position are and what to expect in the way of a time commitment. The deadline is October 1. If there are any contested positions, there will be a ballot and candidacy statements in the November/December Zündfolge.

Board terms are for the calendar vear. Election results will be announced at the annual banquet in January and in the February Zündfolge.
