Tri Cities Wine Tour



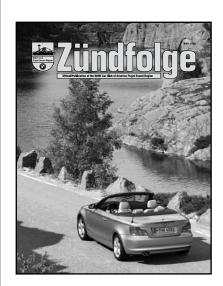

We will be visiting wineries mostly in Prosser and Benton City, but the weekend will be flexible enough for you to wander west to explore on your own if you desire. Prosser has established wineries such as Hogue, Snoqualmie and Kestrel, as well as lesser known boutiques that you've likely never tried, like Airfield, Chinook and Alexandria Nicole. In Benton City we will visit premier wineries such as Fidelitas, Kiona and Hedges. Benton City is also host to the Red Mountain appellation. Red Mountain's Klipsun Vineyard and Ciel du Cheval Vineyard contribute to world class Washington wines from Quilceda Creek, Mark Ryan, Long Shadows, Col Solare, Betz and more.

Overnight accommodations will be at the Hampton Inn in Richland. A block of rooms has been saved for us, but you will need to contact the hotel directly for reservations. To get the discounted rate, call 1-509-943-4400 and tell them you are with the Puget Sound BMW Club. King or double queen city view rooms are \$104, river view rooms are \$114.

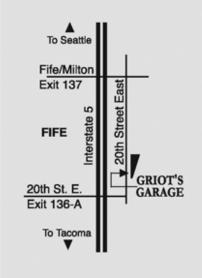

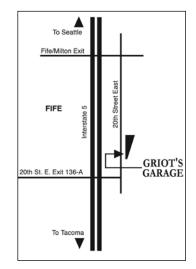

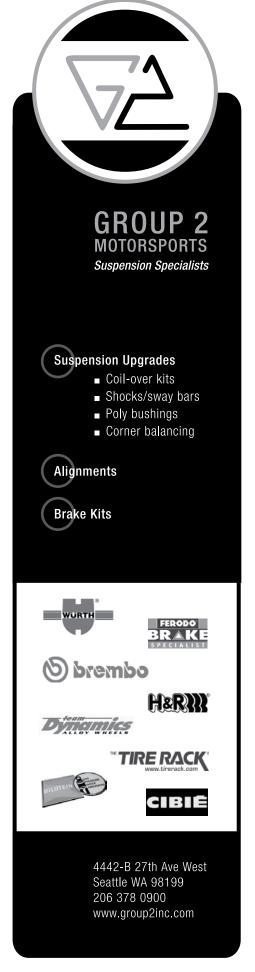
There will be approximately 250 vintage race cars, 1969 and older, entered in the races. The featured marque this year is Porsche, who is celebrating their 60th Anniversary this year. Al Unser, Sr. will be the guest celebrity.

As usual, the car corral provides an opportunity for local car clubs to meet and display their cars. The BMW Club will once again participate in the Car Corral.

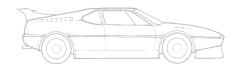
To allow for more members to participate in the corral, the Club is limiting members to one day. Each car club is limited to twenty cars each day. To participate in our corral, you must register

and pay \$25 per day in advance. This \$25 covers the car, driver and a program. Each additional adult passenger will be charged \$25 at the gate. Reduced price tickets are available for children. The BMW corral has always had a waiting list in the past, so sign up early to secure a place for your BMW. (Friday is a practice day for racers; no formal car corral activities are scheduled.)

Again this year there will be judging of the cars in the corral. Corral cars must be parked in the corral between 8 a.m. and 10 a.m. each day. Corral participants are invited to take part in a parade lap of PR during lunch each day. We will have a tent in the BMW corral for Club members to visit and to answer questions about the Club for potential members. MOTOR SPORTS



I've been surprised by the level of interest in our Car Control Clinics and High Performance Driving Schools. The interest is high! That's great as these programs are two of the best benefits the Club offers to members.

We have events scheduled at Pacific Raceways on Thursday, May 1, Friday, July 11, and Thursday, September 25. All these dates will include a High Performance Driving School (HPDS) on the track and a Car Control Clinic (CCC) on the paved parking area. Attending a CCC is a prerequisite to the HPDS. The cost of each CCC is \$80 per participant. The HPDSs are \$210 per participant.

Attending a CCC is something every Club member (every driver!) should do sometime. It will teach you a lot about your car. You will be a better driver. Attending a HPDS is a thrill; one of the best things many people ever do for themselves. But I'll be the first to admit, it isn't for everyone. While we build up to it gradually, there is no getting around the fact that the speeds are high. It is, after all, a High Performance Driving School.

The CCCs at Pacific Raceway will include these exercises: slalom, high performance braking and collision avoidance. After lunch time you'll get to take "parade laps" of the big track. Then you'll get a chance to autocross. The end of the day will bring ride-alongs with the Instructors on the big track. It will be quite a day!

For the HPDS, we put everyone into one of four groups. Each group gets four driving sessions on-track. At all times you will have an instructor in the right seat. These are schools and you'll always be learning. And having fun.

Remember, registration for all events is handled through the website www.MotorsportsReg.com. Make sure you open an account there. And make sure you register for the right event because the CCC and HPDS will share a date and location.

Welcome Back Convertibles

A couple of years ago we made a decision to exclude convertibles from our CCCs and HPDSs. This was due to the specific circumstances at the tracks we use. Both Bremerton Raceway and Pacific Raceways have limited runoff space and ditches or embankments that make rollovers possible. It just isn't safe to drive convertibles at these locations. We hated to make the decision to exclude convertibles but it was the right thing to do.

With our new plan to hold CCC on the paved area at Pacific Raceways, the circumstances are different. The large, flat paved area makes rollovers virtually impossible. So we've decided to allow convertibles in the CCC at Pacific Raceway. Welcome back convertible owners!

Remember, this is limited to the CCC. We still can't allow convertibles on the big track.

Another Policy Change

We have made one other policy change. This relates to the electronic safety systems on modern cars. These include traction control and Dynamic Stability Control (DSC). In the past we used to advocate that these systems be disabled under limited circumstances. Our new policy is that these factory electronic safety systems remain enabled at all times at our HPDS. We still allow and encourage disabling these systems during certain exercises at the CCC to demonstrate their effectiveness.

This policy change caused a lot of discussion and dissent among the Instructor corps. However, we used the new policy at our first HPDS and the experience was generally good.

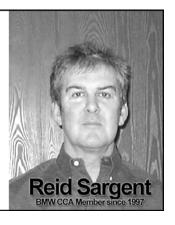

The 2002ti has finally hit THE ROAD with everything in working order. The stiff brakes that haunted the final stages of its return from the accident were cured by a new boost unit and a new master cylinder. It was great to be able to bomb the brakes and not break my leg, and to slam my chest into the shoulder strap. I wanted to just replace the booster and see if that was my problem. I didn't think the master cylinder was the issue but I purchased a new one just in case. I decided to do the work only once so I put in the new master cylinder when I did the booster. The booster was definitely bad as this one passes all the tests. That was the last system that stopped the car from again being worthy of some track time. Previously the entire suspension was refreshed and the new short neck 3.91 LSD was swinging with new Tii rear trailing arms, and polyurethane bushings everywhere—a bit squeaky but REAL tight and crisp. The drive train was all set for a return to the land of legal speed and G-force.

It's been a number of years since I've spent any driving time at the track as the 2002 was needing to be refurbished again and the house projects took time and money away from doing the work on the car. The accident screwed the time frame again but forced the complete refurbishment. The time had come to enjoy the roar again. I went over all the work to recheck everything and tweak some clearance at the front struts for the 15x7 Kosei with the Bridgestone SO3s check the timing, reset

the carbs and wait for the Sunday event. Since the car hardly gets driven it seemed wasteful to keep much gas in the car. The fix of the right rear trunk mated a later quarter panel to the car. The later quarter panel uses a different tank and rubber filler

attendees hadn't seen a 2002 all ready to scream around the track. I jokingly reminded a few that the car was older than many of them. Respect your elders, my parents always told me. A few there remembered the old days. The greatly increased grip was the

seat time would come back in time. The car had so much stick and the brakes worked so well that the memory brake points were all wrong. Hit them there and coast to the turn-in point. Brake later next time was the mental note. The new grip made it



neck. It turns out the later filler neck has a much different connection at the fender/ filler neck. The extent of the difference wasn't discovered in time for my fix to prove not up to a full tank and left hand g-loads.

It was a bit odd going out to the track as a participant instead of an organizer. The anticipation of the weekend, and the week bonding with the car, was a real throwback. It was fun again. The car was filled and out to the track I went. The looks the car got as I unloaded it were a bit strange. Many of these

new variable in the way the car and I would feel around the track. Although it had been a few years, the muscle memory of the many years of easy point to the car where I wanted. No understeer at 3Aat least with the entry speeds I was using. No fender rub either, but 205/50-15s really fill



the wheel well and will touch at full lock. The chicane is a rhythm section that the car has always worked well in. The 15 inchers turned in so quickly and the car changes direction quickly so it was easy to get the timing and the uphill left at full tilt in a full 4-wheel drift out to the exit point was one of the highlights of the day. Turn eight was a kick with the turn-in I had. I was able to put the car exactly where I wanted on exit to set up for the new-to me turn nine. My concerns of how to deal with this were overdone. Just late apex and the car was geared such that I could just feather and turn the car and stick the throttle about

5500 and go for it down the front straight. The kink is iust that—a kink—steer it and look for a bigger car to draft. The little car would hit about 105 through turn one and a little more down the short hill. The brakes were up to the next task but there was a completely new brake point. No brake pad fade as the Porterfield RS4S in front and the rear drums retarded the car with control. It seems the only thing I couldn't test turned out to be the homecoming' only wet spot. The gas tank/quarter panel interface was leaking in hard lefts like turns 2 and 8, and the cars behind and the turn workers were taking notice. It seems all my really hard test

onramps are rights and never with this much gas. The car was so much fun, but I had to stop and wait for another day. To suffer this after all the little car had to put up with to get here wasn't so bad. Many felt bad for me, but I wasn't safe for myself or others. Otherwise, all the new stuff works really well together. The grip is much higher than I have ever driven, with response. I'm still getting used to. The cobwebs will be cleaned out and the car's repairs are straight forward. The next event will be a real gas, not a gas leak.

The fix is to go totally late model, get the long neck gas tank and new style rubber filler neck. The rubber piece is nearly \$90 and the used tank was only \$75-thanks BC. To clean, etch and seal will take another \$50 and some external paint, and then it's all good again. I'm going to see if I can put foam from a fuel cell inside my tank to baffle the sloshing. It would reduce my capacity but this car's long touring days are over. I should be able to get the foam through the fuel sender hole. I'll let you know if it works.

The picture is the car on entry to the chicane. In looking close, the weight transfer is just what you'd expect. I've finished braking and turning for the apex. I like the way tire footprints look.

He wonders if there could be something wrong with it because it is not on a BMW dealership lot, so I get the VIN and do some research. It came from the Puget Sound area (remember I live in Central Washington) and has been serviced by BMW of Seattle and BMW Northwest.

I contact him again and let him know that the dealer is being straight up with us on the car. The local dealer stated that he picked up the car in the Seattle area. He then says "Well, what if it has some big issue that we are not aware of." Fair enough; I take the VIN and go a step further. By pulling a few strings I get the complete service history on the car. Good news—the big issues that plague all E38s have been addressed. The radiator has been replaced, the crankshaft sensor has been replaced, and it has been serviced at all required intervals.

Okay, now what do ya say? "I'll go drive it," he says. Do you see what is

happening here? I am getting emotionally involved, and I really want him to buy this car. I mean here we have a perfectly good—scratch that—great BMW! It meets all the stated requirements, the asking price is right, the money is in place. What could go wrong?

He contacts me and says "I am just not sure." Not sure about what? I did the homework; you said you wanted a 740 like mine. You have the means to support this car; if you don't buy it who will; what will happen to this beautiful 740; it could end up on the street.
