Safety Gear Tech Session/Racing

February 28

HAVE YOU EVER CONSIDERED TRYING YOUR HAND AT RACING? On February 28 we're holding an informational meeting at Speedware in Redmond to talk about local area road racing. Find out what it takes to get involved and actually go racing. We've held this type of event in the past and several of those in attendance have obtained their licenses and are going at it, fender to fender, in several different series locally and nationally.

We'll be holding this event in conjunction with the Safety Gear Tech Session, immediately following that event at the same location. The Safety Gear Tech starts at 10 a.m. and runs until noon. We'll be starting up as soon as that is finished and run until about 1 p.m. After that, I'll hang around the racecar and answer any lingering questions, as I don't want anybody leaving with something unanswered.

The format of the session will be a discussion of the different sanctioning bodies involved with Road Racing on the West Coast (ICSCC, SCCA, SOVREN and NASA) as well as what it takes to get a license. We'll go over

associated costs, the stack of forms that need to be filled out, as well as answer questions along the way. I'm also arranging for several different types of racecars to be present so that we can go over class types (production-based as well as purpose-built) and required safety gear (both for driver and equipment). Several licensed drivers will be on hand to describe why they race what they do as well as answer any questions you may have. Lastly, we'll cover renting versus buying versus building a competitive racecar and the associated costs.

Who should come to this event? I think ALL of our experienced lappers from this Club should attend. I'm a strong proponent of everyone pushing themselves to new heights, and if you've been driving at local HPDE for years, you need to try something new. Get a new perspective, and see what it is that separates driving fast from true racing. Even if you don't have a ton of experience, but you really enjoy your car and the challenges that come with controlling that car at the limits, this session is for you. I hope to see you all there!

BMW of North America, LLC confirmed both of its BMW Advanced Diesel models with Blue-Performance technology have qualified for an Internal Revenue Service Advanced Lean Burn Technology Motor Vehicle Tax Credit. In choosing vehicles that will burn significantly less fuel and

produce significantly fewer greenhouse gas emissions, purchasers of the 335d Sedan will qualify for up to a \$900 tax credit while purchasers of the X5 xDrive35d Sports Activity Vehicle® will qualify for up to a \$1,800 tax credit.

Both BMW Advanced Diesel models keep the promise of the Ultimate Driving Machine® while delivering class leading fuel efficiency. With 265 horsepower and 425 lb-ft of torque available from the 3.0-liter sequential twin-turbo 3.0-liter inline six-cylinder diesel engine, the 335d is capable of accelerating from 0 to 60 mph is six seconds flat while the X5 xDrive35d will do it in just 6.9 seconds. In spite of this level of performance the 335d Sedan, the most fuel efficient BMW ever sold in the US, delivers 23 miles per gallon city and 36 miles per gallon on the highway according to the US EPA. The X5 xDrive35d is rated at 19 mpg city and 26 mpg highway. Both models are capable of traveling nearly 600 miles on a single tank of fuel.

MOTOR SPORTS

LAST MONTH IN THIS COLUMN I discussed the benefits of why you should attend a Car Control Clinic (CCC) or High Performance Driving School (HPDS). This month I'd like to talk about the costs of these events and why they cost what they do. Like most hobbies, high performance driving is not inexpensive.

First of all, the chapter's philosophy is to try and make almost all events break even or make a little money. That doesn't always happen but that's our goal. Why? Because only a few members benefit from any given event. Contrast this with the *Zündfolge*, the chapter website or discounts at area businesses—which benefit all members. This means that the prices of CCC and HPDS are cost-based with a margin for unexpected expenses or to allow for an undersubscribed event.

What are the major costs of these events? The biggest one is track rental. This year, Pacific Raceway costs \$4,200 for each of the two Thursday events we have (April 16 and May 21), \$5,200 for our Friday (July 10) and a whopping \$10,400 for our Sunday event (September 13). Yep, and at those rates, the track is busy almost every day of the year. We pay an additional amount for the pad used for the CCC, typically about \$750 a day. We have two EMTs on standby which cost \$1,000 with their vehicle, security is \$200, restrooms are \$200, the track sweeper is \$250 and insurance is about \$1,500. All of these are mandatory and all but the insurance is through the track with no opportunity to look for a cheaper vendor. The insurance is through the national club and is a good deal.

Corner workers are \$1,000 a day, the water truck for the skid pad is about \$400 and supplies are about \$500. Lunches for the group are about \$2,000 for everyone involved. If you add all that up, (you don't have to; I've done it) a

Thursday's costs are over \$12,000 for the day. Sunday, with the higher track rental fee, has costs over \$18,000. We have the track for seven hours each day, so I figure about \$1,700 per hour on Thursdays and about \$2,600 per hour on Sunday.

The cost per person depends on event capacity and that financial cushion we build in for unforeseen items or an event not filling up. Each CCC can accommodate twenty people and each HPDS will accommodate up to sixty students comfortably.

Crunch those numbers and the entry fee for the Thursday CCC is expected to be \$125 while the HPDS will probably be \$225. The Friday CCC will probably also be \$125 and the HPDS will be \$250. The Sunday events are expected to be \$150 for the CCC and \$350 for the HPDS. Yeah, that's a lot, but now you can see what are the real costs of this sport.

If you've looked at professional schools, you know these prices are actually pretty low. And the reason for that is our volunteer instructor corps. These guys and gals are superb. But they are riding along with you folks and teaching you what they know just for the joy of it and for a little free track time. For most businesses, payroll is the biggest cost. Our payroll is zero.

So start saving your money for these four special days in 2009.



2008 Financial Report

THE CLUB'S FINANCIAL STATEMENTS are published annually. The Club remains in robust financial health, which allows us to pursue a lot of activities which promote membership benefit.

BMW CCA Puget Sound Region is a chapter of BMW CCA but separately incorporated in Washington State. We are a non-profit. Our main purpose is to maximize member benefit. This is a fiduciary responsibility the Board of Directors takes very seriously. The chapter does raise a significant amount of money for local charities but this is a secondary purpose. This charitable giving generally comes from specific events rather than from the general treasury.

Members' dues go mostly to the Zündfolge magazine, the benefit that everyone enjoys. Events are budgeted to break even. Sometimes they make a little money and sometimes they lose a little money. For smaller events with no revenue source, the money comes out of the treasury. Usually this is limited to \$200 per event.

Since we are a non-profit, and we have a good reserve, a loss of \$5,350 for the year seems very reasonable. The healthy cash position allows us to prepay for track dates and insurance. It also provides a "rainy day fund" in case we have some financial problems, which most chapters have at one time or another.

The journey from the Corvette to the M3

His name is Bill Buchanan and he is passionate about cars. You may know him. He drove a 1966 Corvette when he was an Air Force pilot in the '70s. Bill answered the call to tell us why he drives BMWs.

Questions We Asked

- Tell us about your car: when did you buy it, why did you buy it?
- What modifications have you made and do you like the mods (we could all use each other's experience and
- Is there an interesting story involving vour car?
- What was your first car? Your first
- What car would you buy if there were no limitations?

His Story

"Back in the '70s, I owned a 1966 Corvette roadster. I was a hotshot Air Force pilot, and owning one seemed obligatory, but I loved that car! I used to get upset with it whenever it would develop a problem, and I'd put it up for sale at a high price I thought no one would pay. The ad would run its course, and I'd cool down, fix the problem and love my car again. My wife always got a kick out of that! Well, one day, during the course of running an ad "at a price no one would pay," a doctor came by,

test drove it and bought it on the spot! No negotiation—he just pulled out his checkbook and paid for it!

"As time went by, I drove more practical vehicles until I started getting the fever again a few years back. I began seriously looking for another roadster about two years ago; but ran into a problem. I couldn't find a roadster that fits someone 6 ft. 3 in. tall with a bad back!

"On a day when my back was feeling particularly good, I stopped at the local BMW dealership to see what they had. I found a 2004 3.0 Z4 roadster and bought it quite impulsively! What a blast to drive—and I was back in the roadster business! But after a short while I found it was killing my back. This was never going to work. Those cars are sprung so tight that after an hour of driving it I found I was sprung just as tight! I looked like a stud when I was in it, but I looked like an old man getting out of it.

"I was in a predicament: I'd made a mistake and had to correct it. My son told me, 'you should have bought an M3,' So a short four months after buying the Z4, I found my M3 at BMW Bellevue. We agreed on a price and I came home with my newest BMW.

"Anyway, the M3 is my fourth BMW. My first was a '97 328i, the car that made me fall in love with BMWs. I wish I still had it. We lost it because of a car shuffle when my son went away to college. We gave him the old Volvo family car and had to replace it. The only answer was to trade the BMW in for something larger (an Audi A6—I love German cars!).

My second BMW is the 325i pictured in the garage photo. My son purchased it from of me a couple of years ago and still owns it. The Z4 and the M3 were my third and fourth BMWs.



I've never modified any of my cars —owning the Corvette convinced me of the value of keeping them absolutely original. That's my personal preference: if you're inclined to modify a car to suit your tastes, by all means, do so. I've always kept resale in mind, and to that end, I've always left my cars original.

"If I were to tell you today what car I'd buy if money were no object, I'd probably change my mind tomorrow. I'm fickle; I admit it! I would love to have the financial ability to own a twenty-five-car garage and fill it—or to have a different car every year, one at a time. Alas, money is an object, but I have no complaints. The M3 is fine place to limit oneself. For pure drivability, without getting into the 'super cars', there just isn't any comparison! "But I do need to go look at that new '09 roadster ..."

BMW Rahal Letterman Racing Team M3 Debuts at Sebring Winter Test

Team is Fired Up and Ready to Go

A new era in North American motorsports begins on January 26th when the first BMW Rahal Letterman Racing Team M3 drives onto Sebring International Raceway for opening day of the American Le Mans Series Winter Test.

The official debut of BMW of North America's newest racing program comes less than one year after the announcement of BMW's return to ALMS competition was made at the Chicago Auto Show on February 11, 2008.

With final design changes made by BMW Motorsport following European and US testing, the new M3 race car was assembled by the BMW Rahal Letterman Racing Team crew over long days and late nights beginning in December. The M3 received its final homologation inspection on Wednesday, January 21.

The test will mark the first time drivers Bill Auberlen, Joey Hand, Tommy Milner and Dirk Müller will drive the ALMS M3 and the very first time the three Americans will be behind the wheel of a fourth-generation race car.

"The race to the race track has ended and we are pleased to start the 2009 season," said Martin Birkmann, BMW of North America's Motorsport Manager. "BMW is delighted to return to the track with the latest M3 bringing MPower back to ALMS competition. We are also pleased to introduce BMW EfficientDynamics to the North American motorsports community. Through BMW EfficientDynamics every part of every BMW is maximized for optimum performance and efficiency, whether maximizing mileage or MPower."

"The BMW Rahal Letterman Racing Team has worked extremely hard to get the new BMW M3 ready for the ALMS Winter Test and we expect to get a lot accomplished over the three days of testing," said team co-owner Bobby Rahal.

"We are excited not only to get the cars and drivers on track together, but also to give the BMW fans their much-anticipated first look at the M3 race car."

BMW EfficientDynamics is a philosophy adopted by the BMW Group that drives everything the company does. All BMW road cars are designed to maximize efficiency while remaining true to the promise of "the Ultimate Driving Machine." Applied to the latest M3 GT2 race car, BMW EfficientDynamics makes more engine power by reducing internal friction to increase horsepower and reduce the cooling load. It is what BMW engineers can do with those gains that are at the heart of EfficientDynamics. The new M3 race car looks quite different than previous generations because BMW Motorsport was able to reduce the size of cooling openings and channel the air more efficiently, making the new racing car more aerodynamic. This car goes a few steps further by sealing drag inducing openings in the cockpit and incorporating a new "on-demand" air conditioning system. When the proper temperature is reached the system disengages to reduce parasitic losses. The power steering system is "corner-sensing", supplying assist when required, but disengaging when the car is straight.

Birkmann continues, "We look forward to educating the public, as well as our GT2 class competition, on the benefits of BMW EfficientDynamics."

The Winter Test will be held January 26, 27 and 28 at Sebring International Raceway. The BMW Rahal Letterman Racing Team will host a media conference on Tuesday, January 27 at 10:45 a.m.




