

Focke-Wulf 190 to Make Flying Debut



Paul Allen's first BMW-engined warplane is in Everett and made its static debut on April 23. A few Club members were there to see this and other planes in the Flying Heritage Collection. The plane has been restored to as-new condition and has the livery worn when it was shot down over Russia towards the end of World War II. The pilot was Paul Ratz and Herr Ratz's name is on the plane with its Luftwaffe markings.

On June 18, Saturday, the plane is scheduled to make its flying debut, weather permitting. How many of you have heard the sound of a 14-cylinder BMW engine? No, I haven't either but I'm looking forward to it.

The Flying Heritage Collection is mostly WWII warbirds. There are American, British, German and Russian planes, but the Collection seems to be most heavily weighted towards German machinery. When you come to visit the FW-190 A-5, be sure you also see the V-1 and the piloted V-1! The Japanese weren't the only ones with suicide missions. There is also a rocket-propelled plane that looks like a cartoon.

My favorite plane in the collection isn't a WWII plane but an earlier one. It's a Curtis Jenny with fabric wings with wood supports and metal stays. And bamboo parts too! It is a really special machine. But there are a lot of really special machines here.

I'm told that Paul has an 80-foot cannon on site but I didn't see it. At eighty feet, this isn't some little Howitzer! I guess Dan Akroyd flew up to Paine Field just to witness the canon being fired. It made so much noise

that the police got calls from ten miles around. When the police found out it was Paul's canon, they told him not to do it again. Except, "Paul, would you do it once more for us?" And I'm told he did. So if you think the Flying Heritage Collection is just about big toys for big boys, well you're right.

Since the plans for these Fly Days sometimes change at the last moment, please check the Club's website forum under events for the latest information.

Admission to the Collection is \$12 for adults, \$10 for seniors and military, \$8 for those six to fifteen and free for children under six. You can also buy an annual pass for \$50 which includes two adult guest passes. Watching the Fly Days from the parking lot is free.

JUDGED CLASS

Want a trophy to line your shelf? Here's your chance. Cars are judge only on cleanliness and condition, not on originality. The judging criteria can be reviewed on the club's website. To participate in the judged classes you must be a member of the BMW CCA, BMW ACA or Canadian BMW CCBC.

Cars are judged in three major areas: exterior, interior (including trunk) and engine bay. The underside of the car is not judged. A three-member team whose independent results are then totaled to determine a score for each judged entry. This process is designed to be as fair and objective as possible. For class competition there are bonus points for mileage which evens out the competition for high versus low mileage cars. The top BMWs from each class, are lined up for a final review by a three-judge team, and the Best in Show Award is determined. Previous scores are not considered as the judges choose the cleanest, most dazzling BMW on the lawn.

DISPLAY CLASS

The Display Class is a terrific way to take part in the show for those who don't wish to compete but want to come and show off their pride and joy. Just clean it up a bit, and you'll be good to go! You'll be parked with others among the judged cars in your class.

All participants will receive a Griot's Garage sample kit, a commemorative 11x17 poster, a cool refrigerator magnet and chance to win raffle prizes during the day.

I JOINED THE BMW CCA PSR in 2001, shortly after purchasing a Z3, and started a now decade-long adventure with the Club. In 2003, de-Anna and I attended a wine tour to the Lake Chelan region which, at the time, was home to a very small group of wineries that were experimenting with estate vineyards, but still purchasing a vast majority of their grapes from established regions in the Columbia Valley. It was a hit-or-miss affair with some wines tasting surprisingly well, and others clearly a work in progress; the effect of inexperienced winemakers, new untested vineyards (the earliest planted vines didn't start producing fruit until 2001), or a combination of both. That was the last time I visited Chelan, until now.

Eight years later, Lake Chelan boasts its own American Viticultural Area (AVA). Established in 2009, the AVA designation recognizes the unique micro-climate, casually referred to as the "lake effect" that regulates temperature, and glacier-deposited soil which contains notable quantities of quartz, granite and mica. Currently there are sixteen wineries that call the Lake Chelan AVA home. These wineries. many with years of experience in the Chelan Valley, are starting to produce exceptional wines that are reminiscent of old-world French varietals and blends which are characteristically low alcohol

with lively acidity and an earthy mineral backbone; a refreshing detour from the increasingly bold and extracted wines that winemakers feel they need to produce to satisfy the critics and marketing engines. And while you will find the usual bottlings of Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot and Chardonnay, the real adventure here is Syrah, Malbec, Sangiovese, Viognier, Riesling and various Rhonestyle blends, both red and white. You'll even see Pinot Noir on a few winery lists. I didn't think it was possible, but at least one Pinot I tasted was remarkably good!

This year, you won't have to travel to France to experience a "new" wine region. Lake Chelan is just a hop, skip and a jump over the mountains, courtesy of the North Cascades Highway. As you might imagine in the Chelan Valley, most of the wineries are situated above the water with tasting bars and outdoor patios that offer postcard views of the lake and surrounding mountains.

The date for this year's tour is Friday September 23 to Sunday September 25. On Friday, we will drive the long, scenic route from the Seattle metro area, over the North Cascades Highway, and down to Chelan where we stay two nights at a waterfront hotel in Chelan. For Saturday and Sunday our caravan will travel through the hills for wine tasting and meals, mixed in with some free time to explore the city and its amenities. I'm still working out the dining arrangements, but this year will definitely include a group dinner on Saturday and lunches on both weekend days. We might even squeeze in a dinner on Friday if everything falls into place.

Registration information including costs and the full schedule will be posted to all our media outlets around the beginning of July, including the July Zündfolge, bmwpugetsound.com, Facebook, twitter and the email list. If you've attended a recent wine tour, you know that this event fills up fast (last year it took only seven hours). Don't miss out!



The PRO3 Line

Green Flag Racing for 2011!

The Weekend of April 29–30 marked the start of the regular championship points season for the International Conference of Sports Car Clubs (ICSCC), where PRO3 calls "home." True to form, the weekend was made all the more exciting because of PRO3. A total of 17 PRO3 cars were on hand to race on Sunday after two days worth of qualifying efforts to find placement on the grid, and although this made for a strong season-opening grid, it was only slightly overshadowed by the PRO3 Novices on Saturday.

The Novices (twenty-eight total) were led by our own Bob Mearns (PRO3 #161) as the new ICSCC License Director. And by all accounts from the Novice group, Bob did a great job with keeping the "newbies" focused and on track—literally and figuratively! Among those new Novice drivers were ten PRO3 drivers. If memory serves correct, that would make for one of the largest number of new PRO3 drivers at any one Novice race within ICSCC. Based on the perma-grins seen around the paddock after the Novice race Saturday evening, you can bet that we will see the majority of these drivers return to action for future events. I expect we will see increasing grid counts among PRO3 this season!

Among those Novice drivers, there was one car driven by a young hot shoe with a familiar last name: Cameron "Cam" Van Lierop. Cam is the son of threetime PRO3 champ, Jeff Van Lierop, and judging from his performance on track behind the wheel of the Country Green grass car, it was obvious that the speedgene runs deep in this family! Bob Mearns had some fun with the PRO3 Novices and gridded the cars together then inverted the order. This put Cam at the back of the PRO3 Novices where he proceeded to make quick work of the group, making his way to the front of the PRO3 Novice field. Cam will be one

to watch as he progresses through the Novice program for sure.

There was one particular "Novice" who caught my attention from the registration list, Bruce Feller. Now, to call Bruce a "Novice" does not give the right accounting of exactly who this guy is and why his name might be familiar to you. Bruce has been a part of PRO3 since its earlier beginnings and has plenty of time behind the wheel of PRO3 cars at every one of our northwest tracks. Bruce took some time off over the past couple years to focus on business matters but just cannot seem to keep much of a distance from his PRO3 family! As per ICSCC regulations, to regain his Senior License from two years ago, he must complete an Observation Race where his peers have the opportunity to watch him race and help the License Director make the decision whether or not to advance him back into the grid. Bruce showed he hadn't lost his racing acumen and proved to be worthy of retaining his spot on the PRO3 grid right where he belongs. Personally, I'm really excited to see Bruce racing again. He is the consummate PRO3 supporter and has continued to be a fixture trackside at many of the Portland events, even though he was not driving. It's good to have you back Bruce!

I think Steve Schaffer summed it up best when he reported the action of Sunday's events to me this way: "Sunday was a great day for racing, right up to the PRO3 race!" Maybe the cobwebs of the winter off-season were too thick that day, or maybe the cosmic racing forces were not with PRO3; regardless of "why," Group 1 was no picnic for a number of PRO3 cars and drivers. Of the seventeen PRO3 entries, sixteen took the green flag and only eleven finished the race. That's some heavy attrition for the first race of a season. Among the issues were three mechanicals and a rather unsightly collision at T7 involving three cars.

Dan Gavrila set the field on fire during Saturday afternoon qualifying with a fast lap of 1:21.747, which earned him Pole Position. Unfortunately, during the Group 5 qualifying session Sunday morning, Dan ran into trouble in T12, found the tire wall to driver's left and made some unplanned cosmetic modifications to his car. The Adare crew set to work and had Dan back on track for the

afternoon's PRO3 race. Possibly related to that event, Dan chose to retire early from the PRO3 race due to handling issues with the car.

Jason Vein driving the freshly-rebuilt orange #188 was having an epic duel with Robert Johnston (red, #41) running nose-to-tail for several laps. Jason spun in T7 in front of David Beagle (green #121) who was trapped with no escape route and t-boned Jason's car. As unfortunate as that was, Martin Berryman (white, #131) was chasing David and ran out of maneuvering room before being able to avoid the melee and ran into the back of David's car. And just like that, in about two second's worth of time, PRO3 lost three cars.

Thankfully, the drivers were all okay and the cars can be repaired. It's just not how anyone wants to start out a full season of racing.

On a much more positive note, the top five finishers for our first race of the 2011 PRO3 season were: Bob Mearns (5th), James Colborn (4th), Jeff Van Lierop (3rd), Dan Rogers (2nd) and the top position on the podium went to D. Rick Edwards driving the TC Motorsports entry that has returned to PRO3 after a couple of years in the Grand AM circuit. Rick thought he would make a strong showing after his absence from Conference and set a new track record for PRO3 at Portland with no chicane, at 1:22.006! Nicely done Rick!
