# Hutchinson to perform at first Live in the Vineyard public event

Fresh from appearances on The Late Show with David Letterman and the Tonight Show with Jay Leno, singer/songwriter Eric Hutchinson will headline the opening event of Live in the Vineyard's concert series next week.

Open to the public for the first time, this Live in the Vineyard charity event will combine great music and fine wine at Napa Valley's Raymond Vineyards.

Raymond Vineyards is partnering with Live in the Vineyard to present Hutchinson in performance with proceeds going to VH1 Save the Music Foundation's mission to restore instrumental music education into our nation's public schools.

Hutchinson has been named an AOL "About To Pop" artist, Yahoo! Who's Next Artist, MSN "One To Watch" Artist and a "VH1 You Oughta Know" Artist.

His latest recording, "Moving Up, Living Down" — which will be released on April 17 — is the follow-up to his breakthrough debut, "Sounds Like This." The first single, "Watching You Watch Him," debuted on the season premiere of ABC's "Grey's Anatomy," and was released in early February.

Hutchinson kicks off four days of music scheduled at several wineries and Napa's Uptown Theater. Live in the Vineyard attendance has been limited to winners of radio station contests all across the country. The winners are invited to attend the music performance showcase which features established and break-out artists. On the bill next weekend are Jason Mraz, Daniel Powter and Richard Marx.

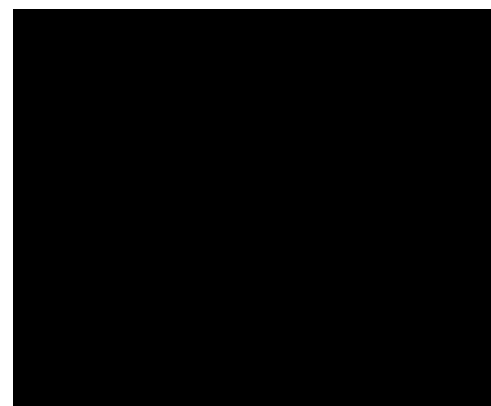
The event in Raymond Vineyards' Crystal Cellar is the first time Live in the Vineyard has been open to area residents, other than sponsors.
