20 sparkling wines to savor this winter

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Prolong the effervescence of the end of the year with bottles more accessible than champagne. Crémants, rosé wines, here is our wide selection.

The holiday season closes with the frosts of **winter** , but it is still possible to jam the bubble in the glass at low prices. The [wines](#) effervescent (*sparkling wine* among the Anglo-Saxons) offer a range of **flavors** almost endless.

Considerable market in the world, with 17.6 million hectoliters (13% of champagne) whistled a year, the old [sparkling](#) remains a specialty **French** , although Germany has become the first producer (excluding champagne) and first Consumer of the planet. Designations of historic Origin of montlouis, Vouvray, [Saumur](#) , claires, **stew** and other sparkling, sparkling wines have been added over the last forty years.

Formerly synonymous with champagne with a very light, creamy mousse, the term refers since the mid-1970s to effervescent wines produced according to the traditional method of double fermentation and aged on lattes (as in champagne). Almost all the wine regions of France have "their crémant".

L'Express has selected about twenty bottles that breathe the terroirs of France, as many pretty cords of bubbles that do not pull on that of the purse!

The Crémants of Burgundy

Maison Louis Bouillot crémant-de-bourgogne Extra Brut white 14,90 euros.

With about twenty references, this house is the "specialist" of Burgundy bubble. Pleasant notes of acacia and toast.
