An Epic Burgundian Story

Bouchard Aîné & Fils has more than 250 years of history with 9 generations dedicated to the excellence of Pinot Noir and Chardonnay. The 18th-century Pavillon Bouchard, in Beaune, houses the cellars where the tradition of quality, elegance and prestige in selecting and making great Burgundy wines is perpetuated.

Origins

A famous appellation from the Côte de Beaune, in Burgundy, taking its name from the village of Pommard.

The appellation area extends over 313 hectares and is devoted only to red wines, with 125 hectares classified as Premier Cru.

Varietal

100% Pinot Noir.

Tasting notes

Visual: elegant and limpid cherry red.

Nose: complex and powerful bouquet, dominated by fruity aromas (Morello cherries, fresh figs) and scents of woodland, undergrowth and spices.

Palate: a firm, powerful and robust wine with aromas of cherries, oak and spices, well-structured with mellow tannins. A wonderfully well-balanced wine.

Food and wine pairing

Ideal with roast game, grilled red meats, cheeses (especially cheeses ripened with a marc de Bourgogne).

Serving suggestions

Between 15°C to 16°C / 60°F.

Ageing potential

From 5 to 10 years.

Vinification and maturing

Vinification in oak vats followed by maturing in barrels for 14 to 16 months, 20% new oak.





Vintage : 2022

2022 brought uncertain conditions, but was finally mild throughout the season!

The harvest took place from around 25 August to 16 September.

The grapes were beautifully healthy, with varying degrees of ripeness depending on the exposure, giving balanced and honest white wines. Maturing ought to bring just the right degree of roundness to red wines with varying qualities, depending on the maturity of each plot.

2022 is a pleasant vintage in terms of quality with good yields, for both whites and reds. The vinification choices have been crucial as to whether to favour acidity or the alcoholic degree.
