

BARGAINS

Wyndham Estate Bin 222 Chardonnay 2010, Southeastern Australia, 13 per cent, \$11.99 (\$3 off sale price, today through Sunday): Aromatic, lifted tropical and citrus fruit scents, with a lightly buttery overtone. Delicate lemon citrus flavours in the mouth, with a hint of tropical fruit. Clean, gently fresh acidity, with a subtle touch of lemon butter on the finish. A steal.

Wyndham Estate Bin 555 Shiraz 2008, Southeastern Australia, 14 per cent, \$12.99 (\$4 off sale price, today through Sunday): Dark berry scents with minty herbal and spicy clove lead the way for generous, fleshy berry flavours, with some currant notes on the smoothly textured palate. Long, well-integrated finish.

Seaglass Pinot Noir 2009, Santa Barbara, Calif., 13.5 per cent, \$13.99 (\$1 off), NSLC general list: I reviewed this splendid little wine back in June. At \$1 off, it is an incredible value. Enticingly perfumed, well structured and showing aromatic cherry and red berry fruit, together with dried grass and hints of vanilla and chocolate. Harmonious, charming, yet remarkably characterful. A great pairing with Christmas turkey.

SPIRITS

The Macallan 12-Year-Old, 40 per cent, \$85.99, 50 NSLC stores (\$4 off until Jan. 4): This one shows the opulent richness of Macallan's 100 per cent sherry cask style with plenty of sherried fruit, vanilla, caramel, spice and a trace of smokiness. Rich flavour has a touch of sweetness and creaminess, offsetting ashy dryness and lightly fiery alcohol.

Highland Park 12-Year-Old, 43 per cent, \$61.99, 43 NSLC stores (\$3 off until Jan. 4): Highland Park is arguably the most balanced of all single malts. Nose reveals subtle peated malt notes combined with floral and spicy overtones. Mouth-filling flavours convey a wide spectrum of fruit, malt, spice, refined peat smoke and an elusive herbal mineral note on the finish.

Highland Park 18-Year-Old, 43 per cent, \$144.99, 21 NSLC stores: Aged in a combination of American and Spanish sherry casks, the nose here is more mellow than the 12-year-old, with a subtle interplay of citrus, cinnamon spice, honeyed floral and fine malty notes. Richly powerful expression in the mouth conveys sweet dried fruit with a trace of vanilla. Very complex finish shows lightly smoky dry oak, with a lingering spicy-floral counterpoint.
