Try a taste of Screaming Eagle or Opus at Oakville Grocery

Well-known local expert Ed Maass, most recently at Dean & DeLuca, became wine program manager at Oakville Grocery in February just after the sale to Jean-Charles Boisset. The store's goal is to make this a destination for wine and food with the most extensive selection of Napa Valley wines in the valley.

As part of that plan, they have

installed several Wine Station dispensers by Napa Technology and now guests can purchase and enjoy eight premium pours by the ounce, half glass (2.5 oz) and glass (5 oz). They are currently featuring the following wines in this program and I'm not aware of any other place you can try some of these famous wines that way. Some prices are included:

- 2016 Screaming Eagle Cabernet Sauvignon 1 oz \$120, 2.5 oz half-glass \$300, 5 oz glass \$600
- 2015 Opus One
- 2014 Futo OV/SL
- 2012 Raymond Generations Cabernet Sauvignon
- 2016 JCB Chardonnay No. 76 1oz pour \$5, 2.5 oz half-glass \$10, 5 oz glass \$18
- 2016 Crossroads Cabernet Sauvignon by Rudd 1 oz. \$7, 2.5 oz. half-glass \$14, 5 oz glass \$25
- 2013 The Mascot
- 2016 Teeter Totter Cabernet Sauvignon 1 oz pour \$5, 2.5 oz half glass \$8, 5 oz glass \$15
