

Nuits-Saint-Georges: with its new winery, the Boisset house offers a prestigious setting

The wine house Jean-Claude Boisset inaugurated last October its new winery in Nuits-Saint-Georges. An impressive achievement, nestled in a part of the former Ursuline convent.

- Four years of work

At Nuits-Saint-Georges in Côte-d'Or, the new Boisset vat house has not gone unnoticed. **This monumental work is built on part of the former Ursuline convent**. The project of the architect Frédéric Didier combines heritage and contemporary lines.

The work was to be completed by the end of 2015. Finally, they lasted four years. Logic, when we discover **the dimensions at stake: 1,500 square meters, more than 2 thousand cubic meters of concrete, 160 piles planted at 20 meters deep.**

We visited this place when the teams were in the process of winemaking.
