JCB sparkling wine flowed, and a 6.0-liter bottle of 2008 Stag's Leap Wine Cellars Cask 23 Cabernet Sauvignon was opened for the occasion. Guests such as former San Francisco Mayor Willie L. Brown, Jr., CBS SFBayArea television personality Liam Mayclem, and MyNetworkTV-affiliated KRON 4 news personality Vickie Liviakis toasted the hotel's position as a San Francisco hospitality gem, with best wishes for 25 more stellar years.
