

# The daily wine: two white Burgundians!

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**Because it is cold, it is Tuesday and I like to spoil you a bit, here are two whites of Burgundy to not let pass!**

The quality of the wines of the Jean-Claude Boisset range is frankly remarkable, especially when we think of the prices practiced and compared with what is done elsewhere in this dear Burgundy (no word game obviously ...)

First, the return of the excellent pouilly-fuissé, this time on the vintage 2015. Taking advantage of the largesse of the weather, we are entitled to wine more glycerine to the dress, more tropical perfume, richer in mouth, but with the same balance and elegance that 2014 went to the brink of being part of my **top 10 wines under \$ 30** . Of the chardo well textured, buttered, with a just acidity and, always at the end of the mouth, an elegant impression of grilled that makes salivate. Not particularly long or complex, but vibrant and enjoyable. Probably among the finest chardonnays at less than \$ 30 at the SAQ.

If you have a little more budget or want to have fun, I strongly advise you to get hold of the Marsannay 2014 of the same producer. Grégory Patriat shows again his know-how with a precise white, complexity more than viable with tones of grilled nut, acacia and yellow apple. One feels a material at the same time nurtured and well tense, marking feature of 2014, a vintage purist in white. It is long with a slight touch of bitterness in the final. A treat, but also a wine that can develop favorably over the next 3 to 5 years.
