In keeping with the adventurous spirit of Buena Vista's founding, we are proud to bring you this delicious 2015 Albariño, known for being lightly colored but aromatic with high acid and bright fruit flavors.

From a steep vineyard in the Red Hills of Lake County, this high elevation vineyard is devigorated with rocky soil and low yields. The red dirt gives the appellation its name and causes the vines to strain, producing small clusters and concentrated flavors.

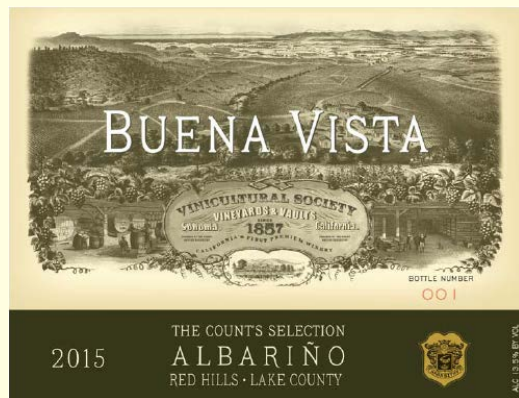
A pale straw color in the glass, aromas of honey and lime burst forth to entice the palate. Flavors of untoasted almonds, grapefruit and a slight grassiness are accented with a touch of cream. Medium plus body and bright acidity make this wine a great accompaniment to light fish dishes or mild cheese.
