founding, we are proud to bring you this delicious 2016 Albariño, known for being lightly colored but aromatic with high acid and bright fruit flavors.

From a steep vineyard in the Red Hills of Lake County, this high elevation vineyard is devigorated with rocky soil and low yields. The red dirt gives the appellation its name and causes the vines to strain, producing small clusters and concentrated flavors.

Our 2016 Albariño is an elegantly balanced and creamy white wine that spreads across your pallet creating a rich yet soft flavor. It opens with floral aromas and hints of musk melon and white plum. The combination of flavors and fragrances creates a savory wine that perfectly pairs with oysters and a variety of fish.
