harvested from two vineyards in the Petaluma Gap that complement each other beautifully. Sloping hills, rocky clay loam\ soils and low-vigor vines help keep yields low while the myriad of clones ensure greater complexity in the wines. Our 2016 Geza's Selection Pinot Noir was fermented in small, one-ton open top fermenters with hand punchdowns before being aged for 11 months in French Oak, 25%

A deep burgundy color in the glass, our 2016 Geza's Selection Pinot Noir opens with delicate aromas of dark red fruit and soft spice. The palette is bursting with flavors of raspberry and blackberry jam that are complimented by notes of cedar forest. Rich, warm and well-structured, this Pinot Noir offers a long finish where sweet fruit carries through and is supported by nice wood notes.
