2017 GEZA'S PINOT NOIR SONOMA COAST SONOMA COUNTY

he Buena Vista Vinicultural Society, formed in 1863 by the winery's founder, Count Agoston Haraszthy to further improve its winemaking prowess and expand its vineyards, has been restored as a collection of unique small-production wines that honor the winery's pioneering spirit and contribution to California winemaking. The Vinicultural Society explores clonal selections, varietals and the incredible terroir of Northern California.





Named for the Count's eldest son who fought in the Civil War. Geza's Selection Pinot Noir is

harvested from two vineyards in the Petaluma Gap that complement each other beautifully. Sloping hills, rocky clay loam\ soils and low-vigor vines help keep yields low while the myriad of clones ensure greater complexity in the wines. Our 2017 Geza's Selection Pinot Noir was fermented in small, one-ton open top fermenters with hand punchdowns before being aged for 14 months in French Oak, 30% new.

Our 2017 Geza's Selection Pinot Noir opens with expressive aromas of dark fruits and a hint of dried rose petal. On the palette, fresh flavors of rich plum, blackberries and a hint of black pepper lead to a soft, silky mouthfeel with a medium body, medium length and pleasantly vibrant, well balanced acidity.
