The Buena Vista Vinicultural Society, formed in 1863 by the winery's founder, Count Agoston Haraszthy to further improve its winemaking prowess and expand its vineyards, has been restored as a collection of unique small-production wines that honor the winery's pioneering spirit and contribution to California winemaking. The Vinicultural Society explores clonal selections, varietals and the incredible terroir of Northern California.

The Vinicultural Society explores clonal selections, varietals and the incredible terroir of Sonoma County. Named for Count Haraszthy's fourth child and first daughter, Ida's Selection Pinot Noir is sourced from the Eastern slopes of the Sonoma Coast, where the grapes ripen under the optimally-balanced conditions and are hand-harvested at the peak of ripeness.

The two vineyards the grapes for this wine are harvested from are planted to clone 777, 115 and 667, with each contributing distinct characteristics to the final wine. Our 2013 Ida's Selection Pinot Noir was aged for 13 months in 100% French oak, 35% new, before being bottled unfiltered.

Our 2013 Ida's Selection Pinot Noir opens with bright red fruit aromas accented brilliantly by a dash of spice. Smokey flavors give way to hints of forest floor before culminating in a lengthy finish on this supple Pinot Noir.
