

2014 JOVITA'S CHARDONNAY SONOMA COAST SONOMA COUNTY

by the winery's founder, Count Agoston Haraszthy to further improve its winemaking prowess and expand its vineyards, has been restored as a collection of unique small-production wines that honor the winery's pioneering spirit and contribution to California winemaking. Chardonnay is harvested from two sandstone soil vineyards in Sonoma, Gap's Crown and Durell Vineyards. The grapes were hand-harvested and whole cluster pressed and the wine was then aged for 8 months in 25% new French Oak before being bottled unfiltered.

The 2014 Jovita's Selection Chardonnay opens with an alluring bouquet of mango and Mandarin oranges with a touch of caramelized vanilla. Full bodied upon the palate, flavors of sautéed peaches, and quince paste are balanced with a hint of citrus zest and low acidity. With a long, clean finish and soft mouthfeel, this Chardonnay is beautifully crafted and truly enjoyable.
